	1. This politician, along with Alexander Hamilton, was a prominent leader in the Federalist Party.
	2. This political party was led by Thomas Jefferson and James Madison.
	3. This was issued by President Washington and declared that the U.S. would not take sides in war between France and Great Britain.
	4. This French official attempted to rally American support for war against Great Britain.
	5. This cautioned the nation against getting involved in European conflicts.
	6. This set the border with Spanish Florida and gained the U.S. access to the port of New Orleans, while Jay's Treaty settled some issues with Great Britain.
	7. This infuriated American public opinion when it was revealed that a French official had demanded a bribe from U.S. ambassadors.
	8. This resulted from President Jefferson's negotiations with France and nearly doubled the size of the U.S.
	9. This British tactic of seizing American sailors for service in their own navy, along with the blockade of French ports, brought calls for war.
	10. This forbid U.S. trade with either Great Britain or France and was issued by President Jefferson to avoid war.
	11. These members of the House of Representatives from the South and West called for war because of Great Britain's apparent support of hostile Native American tribes.
	12. This took place after the U.S. had signed a peace treaty with Great Britain and was one of the few U.S. victories in the War of 1812.
