August 28-30th: Kindergarten Assessment/Staggered Entry Days

During the first week of school, Kindergarteners only come one day. This gives all Kindergarten teachers a chance to get to know your child and complete beginning of year assessments. Also, students will have the chance to become acclimated to a typical day at school in a small group setting. If you have not signed up for an assessment day, please call the front office (387-2168) and do so. On your scheduled day, your child can be dropped off between 8:45-9:10am and will be dismissed at 3:45pm. Please send them to school with a lunch or \$2.25 to buy lunch and a healthy snack (including a drink). You will receive more information regarding their specific assessment day and what room your child will be assessed in the week before school starts.

Friday, September 1st: Kindergarten "Meet the Teacher"

The finalized class lists will be posted today at 12:30 on the windows outside of the front office. Drop in anytime between 12:30-2:00 to meet your child's teacher, explore their new classroom and drop off any school supplies that are too heavy for your child to bring in on the first day of school.

Kindergarten Supply List

The transition to kindergarten is respected as a major milestone not only for the child, but for his or her family as well. The attitude towards school and learning that the child carries with them for life is often determined by this very first experience with school. A smooth transition to kindergarten can help make sure your child is successful in school.

The information provided below is designed to help you prepare your children for their school experience.

You bet, I'm ready for K!

Personal Needs Without help, can they...

- ___ Put on and take off coat
- ___ Tie their own shoes
- ___ Wash their hands
- ___ Snap, button, zip, and buckle

Social Skills Can they ...

- ___ Listen to an adult & Follow simple instructions
- ___ Cooperate with other children
- ___ Sit for short periods of time
- ___ Follow simple two-step directions

Intellectual Skills Do your children...

- ___ Sit and listen to a story
- ___ Hold a book upright and turn the pages
- ___ Know their first and last name
- ___ Tell and retell familiar stories
- ___ Know colors, shapes and sizes
- ___ Counts 0-10

Intellectual Skills (continued)

- ___ Saying the ABC's
- ___ Holds scissors & pencil appropriately
- ___ Recognizes and writes first name (remember-use capital letter for the first letter in a name.) M-a-t-t, not M-A-T-T
- ___ Recognizes the letters within their name

To help with a smooth transition into kindergarten you can follow these additional helpful ideas, provide opportunities to play with other children, teach your children socially acceptable ways to disagree, and encourage social values such as helpfulness, cooperation, sharing and concern for others.


