# meet the TEAM

#### PREPARING YOUR CHILD

Self Help Skills: opening lunch & snack containers, zipping a jacket, using the bathroom independently, tying their shoes

Fine Motor Skills: holding a pencil, correct use with scissors

Literacy: writing their name with correct capital and lowercase letters, identifying letter names and sounds

Math: orally counting to 20+, recognizing numbers 0-10, counting groups of objects, naming basic shapes and colors

#### STAGGERED ENTRY

Your child will only come one day during the first week with 4-5 other kids. We will use this time to assess and observe your child to create balanced classes.

You will get a letter in the mail over summer (beginning of August) assigning you a day and room number!

Monday 8/25, Tuesday 8/26, Wednesday 8/27, or Thursday 8/28



#### CLASSROOM PLACEMENT



You will find out your official teacher on Friday of that week.

If your child's teacher is the same as staggered entry, you won't get a call. If their placement changes, you will get a call from your new teacher!

All students first day together with their official teacher will be Tuesday, September 2<sup>nd</sup>.

You will have the opportunity to better get to know your child's teacher and learn about the year ahead at Open House! This is the same night as PTA's Dinner on the Lawn event and our school's kick off to the new year!

#### TRANSPORTATION

You can get carpool numbers tonight! If your child is riding a bus, go ahead and download the Here Comes the Bus app (School Code: 67500)

We ask that you be consistent with your kindergartener's transportation to help build a routine! If their transportation is changing, please let the teacher know prior to 12:00pm to ensure they get home the right way.

Your child will have a specific tag on their backpack with transportation information. Please keep this on all year!

Our school offers a Before School Care program provided by some WES assistants. You can get more details from the Before School Care table!


Daily attendance is super important to your child's transition to kindergarten

As students arrive they play in free choice centers, such as playdoh, library, blocks, STEM bins, kitchen, babies, etc.



#### BEHAVIOR + sook time

We start each day with a "SOAR Time" Morning Meeting teaching different social emotional skills and lessons from the counselors!



Students work to earn feathers as a class for whole class rewards. They work individually to earn SOAR dots.



#### LETTERLAND & LITERACY



Letterland is our phonics program!
This is how students will learn letter names, sounds, word blending, and other early literacy skills!

We also use the Heggerty program daily during Morning Meeting to practice phonemic awareness skills.

Literacy is when we teach a variety of skills such as: NEST Rotations, decodable books, sight words, & more!

#### MATH & TECHNOLOGY

During the year we will learn: number recognition, counting to 100, sorting objects by attributes, teen numbers, partners of 10, addition, subtraction, 2D shapes, and 3D shapes!

Each student is assigned a Chromebook and will learn how to use it in the classroom! They will not bring these home. They will utilize the apps: Letterland, DreamBox, and MyOn.



#### SPECIALS & RECESS



Students go to specials daily on a rotating schedule. Our school has: PE, art, music, media, and science lab!

Kindergarten has their own playground off of our classrooms. Recess is at the end of the day. Please dress your child accordingly for the weather that day, knowing our recess is at the very end.

# daily SNACK TIME

Please send a small snack with your child daily! This should not be things like candy or a full Lunchables lunch, as it's a quick snack time!

Please label the snack with your child's name and have it in a separate place from their lunch bag so they know which is snack. Many teachers have students put their snack aside in a bin as part of their daily routine to ensure they don't accidentally eat it at lunch time.

We encourage students to bring a water bottle to school daily. We have filtered water stations on each hallway that they can use to refill them.

#### LUNCH INFORMATION

Kindergartners eat in the lunchroom with supervision of the assistants. We encourage you to practice self help skills mentioned earlier to help at lunch.

Breakfast and lunch prices haven't been determined for the school year.
