<p><b>Digital Device</b></p> 	<p>We recommend that students use Chromebooks because they allow students to easily access their WCPSS Google Accounts. Teachers at Carnage Magnet Middle school will be using Google products extensively in their Virtual learning experiences. Students can, however, use any digital device- PCs, Macs, iPads, Tablets- to do this work. Desktops, Laptops, and Chromebooks work best. If your child plans to use a tablet, however, we would recommend that you also purchase a keyboard that they can use with that tablet. Your child will be creating lots of written content in their Virtual Classes and that is easier to complete with a keyboard.</p>
<p><b>Headphones or Earbuds</b></p>	<p>Carnage Magnet Middle School's Virtual Academy will offer students between 2.5 and 3 hours of live instruction per school day. Your children will be interacting with teachers and students in virtual meetings spaces like Google Meet. The headphones or earbuds</p>



your child uses will also need a microphone so your child can participate in conversations with teachers and students.

What style should you buy?

1. Think about your student's comfort. Does your child wear earbuds for several hours straight without complaint -- or would they be more comfortable with "over the ear" headphones? 2. Also, think about the learning style of your student when making your choice. Does he/she move around a lot while learning? If so, wireless headphones or earbuds might be a good choice.

## Virtual Academy/ Plan B Schedule

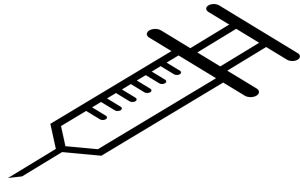

- Students will engage in 4 Core classes and 3 electives.
- Students will have the opportunity to engage in 3 electives per day.
- Attendance will be taken in all classes for live instruction/completion of work/email communication to the teacher.
- Students will receive grades for the work that is assigned and that is turned in
- Students will receive more than 3 hours of 'live' instruction each day.
- Students will have independent work to complete each day.
- Independent work can be completed during the scheduled times or later in the day.
- Breaks are built into the online instructional day for students.
- Students will have one hour for lunch each day.
- Office hours will be available to students for additional time, instruction and questions.

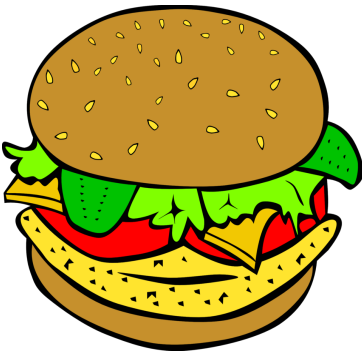
## WCPSS Technology and Device Distribution

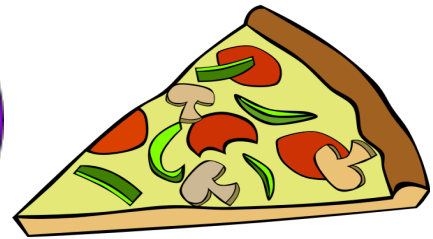


## IMMUNIZATIONS
