

Chinese Classroom Culture and Language Updates

Students learned how to count in Chinese number with hand gestures. They played Pingpong ball and kicked the Chinese shuttlecock counting in Chinese numbers. They explored the culture behind the numbers, such as lucky and unlucky numbers in Chinese culture. Students have also explored the culture and traditions of Chinese Dragon Boat Festival and Chinese Lantern Festival. We shared origin stories of both festivals, customs, traditions, and did many activities around both festivals. For 5th graders, students did research and present on the similarities and differences about the way people celebrate the Mid-autumn festivals (or moon festival) around the world. Students also learned the history of China, population, and popular cities of China, and the Great Wall of China. Some students even made the Great Wall out of legos at home! Students also learned the history of four

treasures of study in Chinese culture: paper, ink, brush, inkstone. Students used ink, paper, and red paint to have created beautiful Chinese plum flower trees.

Students are always highly encouraged to participate Chinese cultural activities out of school to broaden their learning in Chinese culture! Students are encouraged to go to eat in local Chinese restaurants, Chinese or Asian supermarkets, participating in the local Chinese cultural celebration activities such as Chinese Food Festival, Dragon Boat Festival, Mid-Autumn

The Buzz on iStation Reading Benchmarking Tool and Read To Achieve

**Parent Portal Information is being sent home with students. Please look for your unique log in information!



iStation Reading Benchmarking Tool: K-3 teachers at Farmington Woods have completed training with the new reading assessment and benchmarking tool that will be used in all public schools across the state starting in January 2020 with students' mid-year reading benchmark. While the tool and program components will look different, they still provide teachers and families with information on the foundational reading skills that all students need to be successful independent readers. Parents will also have access through this tool to see student information and to access resources to help with reading foundational skills at home.

Additional information, including how to log in to the Parent Connection Portal will go home with All K-3 students when we return from Winter Break.

Read to Achieve: Read to Achieve is a NC State Law designed to ensure students are able to read on grade level by the end of 3rd Grade. Due to the changes in the reading assessment tools and the upcoming changes to the Reading End of Grade Test, the law is being updated. Families K-3 will receive information on the updates and an information session will be held at Farmington Woods Elementary as soon as the updates are finalized and there is information for families. In the meantime, please continue to have your child read 20-30 minutes a night which should include some read aloud time, too. Reading is a skill that requires practice to improve- much like soccer practice is required to learn how to kick a corner kick; piano practice is required to learn a new music piece; swimming practice is required to improve your speed to ribbon in the meet- the way to prepare for the finish line and be on grade level as a reader is to continue to practice reading regularly.

NC DPI- Read to Achieve Information has been updated for 3rd Grade Families and for K-2 families to review and consider as students are learning to be successful readers.

THE IB PYP PARENT - Sharing the Learner Profile at home

The Learner Profile attribute we will look at this month is Communicator. We are fortunate to work in a school with so many opportunities to be communicators in a variety of languages! Below are some ways that you can share the learner profile trait with your children at home.

Students who are COMMUNICA-TORS express their ideas by speaking, drawing and writing or even using mathematical language and symbols. They also communicate in more than one language and are good listeners as well. Being a good listener is an important part of communicating with others.

How can parents help to develop students who are Communicators at home?

 Encourage your child to stay in touch with relatives and friends who live in other places by writing letters, using the phone, sending an email or connecting via skype..

- When working on mathematics homework, encourage your child to explain his/her answer to you orally or by drawing a picture.
- Ask your child thought provoking questions and encourage them to discuss them with you.
 For example:
- o Is there anything you cannot buy with money?
 o Should you get an allowance? Why or why not?
