The official 2019/20 school assignment notices will be sent home will all students on Monday, January 7, 2019. The notice contains important information regarding your child's school assignment and transportation type for the upcoming school year.

- Please verify that your address is correct. If you have moved, please provide the school office with a current proof of residence for your new address (one of the following: a light, gas or water bill).
- If your address is correct and you are satisfied with your child's 2019/20 assignment, no action is required on your part
- If you would like to request a different school assignment for your child for the 2019/20 school year, you must submit an application online during the appropriate window:
- The application window for Magnet and/or Year-Round schools is Jan. 4-30, 2019. (Results will post to parent accounts starting February 19th.)
- The application window for requesting a Transfer Request is Feb. 21 Mar.6, 2019. (Results will post to parent accounts as processed starting Mar. 7th.)

Have you noticed the blank spot in the lobby? A new mural is in the works! Specialist collaboration days are a highlight here at FWES. The morning of learning is composed of our dynamic specialists and classroom teachers collaboratively planning engagements focused on creativity, collaboration, critical thinking and communication. As part of the 5th grade collaboration day in December, students focused on their work in the IB unit "Sharing the Planet." WAKE Up and Read ... Farmington Woods will be participating for the fifth year in a book donation program. What's the Buzz on... The Power of Play

Last year, the Buzz had several segments on the 4C's and how each characteristic plays out in the classroom. The 4Cs are creativity, communication, collaboration and critical thinking. Teachers design instruction to provide students with opportunities to build their own understanding of these skills and practice them in an academic setting. As parents, knowing these terms and using them with our students reinforces the skills that are being fostered in the classroom; however, knowing the terms isn't enough to sustain the 4Cs in our global learners. Students need to be engaged in their environment and play is a powerful step in that process. "When we treat children's play as seriously as it deserves, we are helping them feel the joy that's to be found in the creative spirit. It's the things we play with and the people who help us play that make a great difference in our lives." Fred Rogers.
