McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act

Does your family live in a shelter, motel, campground, park, abandoned building, bus or train station, or some other inadequate accommodation, or is doubled-up with other people due

to a loss of housing or economic hardship? If so, your school-aged children may qualify for certain rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Act.

### Kindergarten Registration for 2018-19

- 2018/19 Kindergarten Registration begins on January 9, 2018 from 9:30am-3:00pm. Registrations are accepted daily between 10am-12noon.
- Incoming kindergarten students must be 5 years old by August 31, 2018.
- Parents should register their incoming kindergarten student at their base school and will need to provide their picture ID, their child's original birth certificate, and a current proof of residence (one of the following: light, water or gas bill, or a lease agreement signed within the past 60 days).
- A North Carolina Health Assessment form and up-todate immunization record is also required and must be presented by the first day of school.

### Magnet and Year Round School Applications for 2018-19

On-line Magnet and Year Round School Application Window will be available January 10-31, 2018 Applications should be submitted through the Wake County Public School System website at Magnet/Year Round Application Process

- Apply anytime during the application window.
- Incoming K students must be registered at their base school and have a student ID # to submit a magnet application. Rising K students who have magnet siblings MUST complete this process to attend FWES.
- Notification of application results will be available on February 14, 2018.

## Magnet Musings

The 5th grade students have already begun work on a final collaborative inquiry project, **The Exhibition**. FWES has held exhibitions for 14 years now, and each one leaves a lasting impression on the students, parents and staff involved. The Exhibition works to synthesize the essential elements of the PYP programme. This culminating experience allows students to exhibit the attributes of the Learner Profile they develop

through small actions, everyone can make an impact. their years as PYP students as well as demonstrate their learning since Kindergarten.

This year the 5th grade classrooms have narrowed their focus to the Central Idea of "People, animals, and the environment are interconnected." In the coming weeks they will continue to inquire and research to learn more about selected topics. A large component of the exhibition is Action. Students will be seeking ways they can take action in the form of increasing awareness of animal and environmental concern, learning about organizations that promote conservation ad animal protection, and devising ways to share their research and findings with the community.
Groups will present their projects on February
15th to the entire school community. We hope that you will join us for this night

Read Around the World ... We continue to read around the world with some our faster travelers moving on into North America. Students began their travin October with a reading log for Africa. Since then there have been logs for Australia and the Polar Regions, and South America. Those students who complete their travels around the world will receive a special globe charm. Can you a "world reader"?

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WAKE Up and Read ... Farmington Woods will be participating for the fourth year in a wonderful book donation program. WAKE Up and Read conducts a



book drive each year to help build home libraries and make books readily available to children who need them. Through the book drive, every child at 10 highneed elementary schools and 20 childcare centers can choose 10 books and keep them for their home libraries. Last year WAKE Up and Read collected over 114,000 books. As a school we will be collecting books from January 20th -March 3rd!! This year our goal at Farmington Woods is to collect 2,500 books to donate. This is approximately 3 books from each student. To help make this easy, Mrs. Grice or Mrs. Wilson will stand at the front of the school to collect books in the carpool lane the week of February 5th - Feb 8th. Books can always

be dropped off in the Inquiry Center or in the front office. Start looking for those books that you are ready to donate .... Let's see if we can collect 2,500 books!

**READvolution** continues through January 12th.At this point we have 54 students who have read and recorded an average of over READVOLUTION WAKE COUNTY 20 minutes per day since the reading challenge began. As a school we have exceeded the district goal of 2020 books read let's see how many more we can read before January 12th!



### 21st Century- 4Cs Learning at FWES... Mrs. Moody

Students have been engaged in exploring communication, collaboration, creativity, and critical thinking with their grade levels. The month of December showed numerous opportunities for students to dig deeper into 4Cs activities!

Hour of Code: 1st-5th grade classrooms participated in the Hour of Code, which is a global initiative to promote the basics of coding! Students were able to collaborate with a team member to create code for various games and celebrate computer science. Two resources available for coding at home are <u>www.code.org</u> (grades 2-5) and <u>www.kodable.com</u> (grades k-2)

 $3^{rd}$  Grade: The half day on 12/21 presented opportunities for  $3^{rd}$  Graders to utilize the 4Cs as they created a Stop Motion video in groups. This video showcased various ways the body can move and allowed students to think critically as they planned and executed their videos using the Stop Motion application on the iPads.

5<sup>th</sup> Grade: Each 5<sup>th</sup> grader participated in an Oregon Trail themed BreakOut Box that required students to communicate with team members, utilize technology, and think critically in order to unlock 5 locks. Once inside the box directions for another activity were found, students later in the month created wagons that their team felt would benefit travelers as they were expanding west. These wagons showcased creativity as students used recycled materials from the Maker Space.

2<sup>nd</sup> Grade: GoogleSlides have been introduced to all 2<sup>nd</sup> graders to promote collaboration through technology. The 2<sup>nd</sup> grade team is excited to use this tool for several upcoming projects!

 $2018 \ will be \ kicking \ off \ with \ 2^{nd} \ graders \ creating \ Stop \ Motion \ videos \ using \ magazine \ clippings \ and \ artwork \ to \ showcase$ their knowledge surrounding the IB unit "How the World Works"!


