Second Grade: Second graders are enjoying our Who We Are unit about studying life cycles of animals and how parent animals might look similar or different to each other. We have taken outside discovery adventures to find evidence of animal life cycles on our school campus. The students show such enthusiasm once they discover that life cycles exist around us. So far classes have taken note of and observed the milkweed bug, honey bees, several monarch caterpillars, and 2 monarch chrysalis. We are looking forward to gaining more knowledge about butterflies as we observe our new caterpil-

lar visitors from our science kits and take a field trip to the Marbles IMAX to watch Flight of the Butterflies.

- Inability to attend to learning activities
- Change in student's usual medical status
- Late Arrival or Early Check Out: The instructional day begins in all classrooms at 9:15am and ends at 3:45pm. Each time a student arrives after 9:15am or is checked out prior to 3:45pm, he/she is missing valuable instructional time. A student who is checked out one day a week at 3:15pm misses a total of 2 hours of instruction that month Please work to make sure your student is in his/her classroom from 9:15-3:45 every day to maximize his/her learning. Our data manager, counselor and social worker will be monitoring this data and contacting families to offer assistance.
- Walk In Transportation Changes: All transportation changes must be submitted in writing. Walk in last minute transportation changes will not be allowed repeatedly and should only be used in the event of an emergency circumstances. Changes due to appointments should be given to the teacher the morning of the appointment. To maintain appropriate safety, students will not be dismissed to parents from the carpool area or from classrooms prior to the start of the After School Program at 4:15pm.

Notes From the Front Office Mrs. Farr, Mrs. Nagy and Mrs. Moore

- Yellow Cards are Needed! In order to insure the school
 has the most current contact information for each student, especially in the event of an emergency, please make
 sure you return your child's card immediately.
- Sick Students: NC Health Policy dictates the events that require students to be excluded (sent home) from school. If your child demonstrates one of these symptoms we are required to send them home. Please make appropriate arrangements if you receive such a phone call. Students must go home from school if the following symptoms are present:
 - Temp of 100 or more (cannot return until they are fever free for 24 hours without medication- if your child leaves during the day for a fever, he/ she may not return the following day as it will not have been 24 hours without fever)
 - Vomiting or Diarrhea (cannot return to school until they have been free of either symptom for at least 12 hours)
 - Severe headache
 - Red, watery eyes with yellow drainage
 - Undiagnosed or treated rash


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



Early Release inspires creativity through inquiry!

We are fortunate as a school to have early release collaboration days where specialists and classroom teachers plan a morning of engagement focused on creativity, collaboration, critical thinking and communication. Friday, Sept 29th was our first Early Release day for this school year.

The Specialist team collaborated with Fourth Grade teachers to present a morning of learning activities relating to their IB unit: How The World Works. Students had the op-

portunity use inquiry as they created scribblers with a motor, made their own Stop Motion video sharing their knowledge of magnets, and explored force and motion with physical education games.

The next early release grade level collaboration will be with Second Grade on October 20th and we need your help! We are trying to stock our makerspace for the creation Please send in the following recycled items so that we can bring student design to life!

Global Read Aloud Begins Oct. 2

We are excited to participate with schools across the Globe in a joint Read Aloud project. K-1 students will be doing an author study with Mem Fox texts; 2-3 students will be reading Fenway and Hattie (Coe) and 4-5 students will read The Wild Robot (Brown). Throughout the project, classrooms at FWES will be working to connect with other classrooms to discuss what they are reading and the global themes.

More Inspiring Learning at FWES...

Music Room: 5th Grade Ringers and Singers has begun! We are looking forward to our first performance at the Family Evening Concert on Friday, December 8. We will also perform Thursday, January 25, and Thursday, May 17.

4th graders have been learning about composers Dvorak and Beethoven in preparation for their trip to the NC Symphony in April. Ask your 4th grader if they can tell you, or show you on a map, where Dvorak is from, or what Beethoven's music was like and what struggle he faced in his life while still composing famous pieces we still listen to! More composers to come. Information on ordering a soprano recorder will be coming home soon.

Students in grades K-3 have been learning to follow listening maps, use bass bars, xylophones and rhythm instruments, and have been exploring composers and songs from various parts of the world including Latin America, Australia and France.

Visual Art:

- Disability History and Awareness Month (DHAM) is during the month of October for Wake County Public Schools. The Arts will be participating in activities to support awareness.
- Students are encouraged to create an original composition for the PTA Reflections program. The theme this year is "Within Reach?" Submissions from home are due to Mrs. Smith by Nov. 1st, 2017 with an accompanying

Scholastic Summer Reading Challenge Update Congratulations to Noah H. and Jack M. who were the winners of the Kindle Fire e-readers from our summer reading challenge. About 100 students read and recorded over 2000 minutes during the summer. An additional 50 students read and recorded 1500 minutes. All of the those students recording a minimum of 1500 minutes received a special summer bear charm. We are still waiting on the final totals from Scholastic, but at last check FWES was among the top 10 schools in the state of NC!!

Read Around the World This year we will again participate in a year long reading incentive program designed to motivate and reward students for reading a variety of books. Read Around the World is designed for two purposes; to encourage the students to use the library catalog to find different kinds of books and to encourage students to read a variety of books. Students will be given their first Read Around the World continent reading log: Africa, in early October. Each time the student reads a book in one of the categories on the reading log, he/she writes down the title of the book in that space. When the entire log is filled out, the log is signed by an adult and returned to the Inquiry Center. For each completed log the student returns, he/she will choose a charm and be given a new reading log for the next continent. As you read with and to your children, please encourage them to look for books that connect to their Read Around the World logs.

Readvolution Wake County Public Schools, in partnership with the Carolina Hurricanes, will be participating in a community-wide literacy campaign supporting daily reading outside of school. The goal of the campaign is to highlight the importance of reading in creating college and career ready graduates.

To help reach WCPSS's Vision 2020, our students will be given a challenge of 20 minutes of reading outside of the school day! For every book a student reads, they will write the title of the book on a paper puck to be added to our Hurricanes hockey goal banner. The goal is to collectively fill our banner with 2,020 pucks! ⇒ PTA Advocacy:

- ♦ We attended the BAC meeting for District 9 on Monday the 18th. Board member Bill Fletcher updated us on the class size mandate coming into effect for the 2018-2019 school year and how it will impact certain schools. Farmington Woods is not one of the 27 schools that will need Board Action (yay). There is the potential of combo classes (2 K classes in one room with 2 teachers to make space and so on, possibly art/music and Spanish to go to a cart), but the goal is to make sure all students get a seat (this is for our school).
- The School Board sent out the first proposal for changes coming down the pipeline. They attached a link to check if your neighborhoods calendar options have changed (i.e gone away) and what your base is. They encourage the public to let Board Members know if this affects them and their children and how (if it does).
- Bill Fletcher suggested that when Congress reconvenes on Oct 4th it will not be to discuss any funding for public schools, so to hold off on any major actions. He said now is

the time to build relationships with our legislatures and board members. He said the May short session is the next time we can start really speaking up to ask for more funding. If parents have questions, they should be calling their school board member about what changes are coming next year.
