We are over 1/4 of the way through the academic school year and were very pleased to read report cards and note the progress our students have made. Through our IB/PYP we will continue to seek ways that will support the growth of all students in all curriculum disciplines. Fall conferences are a great opportunity to discuss your child's growth with the teacher and partner for continued successes.

We have been excited to receive NC DPI testing and growth results for Farmington Woods and to share that our school "Exceeded Growth" for the 2018-19 school year, the second year in a row we have "Exceeded Growth." This measure means that as a school our students grew more than was statistically predicted in ELA and Math on End of Grade

tests. Our growth score was the 10th highest growth score of all schools in our district AND all of our student subgroups met or exceeded their expected growth last year. We are very proud of the hard work of our students and the focus of our teachers on providing an engaging learning environment that requires thinking and application of learning- aligned with the IB/PYP inquiry based principles.

The month of November is a time when we think much about giving thanks and of everything we have to be thankful for in our lives. I must say that I am continually thankful for the amazing FWES community- parents, students, staff and community members- who seek daily to learn and make a difference in the

world. What a wonderful place to get to spend time! Thank you for choosing to be part of our school family and for all you do to make our school the best place it can be or our students!

The Buzz on iStation Reading Benchmarking Tool and Read To Achieve

iStation Reading Benchmarking Tool: K-3 teachers at Farmington Woods are beginning their training with the new reading assessment and benchmarking tool that will be used in all public schools across the state starting in January 2020 with students' mid-year reading benchmark. While the tool and program components will look different, they still provide teachers and families with information on the foundational reading skills that all students need to be successful independent readers. Parents will also have

access through this tool to see student information and to access resources to help with reading foundational skills at home.

Read to Achieve: Read to Achieve is a NC State Law designed to ensure students are able to read on grade level by the end of 3rd Grade. Due to the changes in the reading assessment tools and the upcoming changes to the Reading End of Grade Test, the law is being updated. Families K-3 will receive information on the updates and an information session will be held at Farmington Woods Elementary as soon as the updates are finalized and there is information for families. In the meantime, please continue to have your child read 20-30 minutes a night which should include some read aloud time, too. Reading is a skill that requires practice to improve- much like soccer practice is required to learn how to kick a corner kick; piano practice is required to learn a new music piece; swimming practice is required to improve your speed to ribbon in the meet- the way to prepare for the finish line and be on grade level as a reader is to continue to practice reading regularly.

NC DPI- Read to Achieve there is no information currently at this link, but continue to check for updates.

- We are honored to have with us for the first semester Jaime Cooke. Jamie is completing her graduate degree in Physical Education from UNCW and currently student teaching at FWES.
- FWES Walks to School are the first Friday of each month. We meet in the Kildare Plaza parking lot (in front of Torero's Mexican Restaurant) and leave by 8:30 a.m. Next walks are: 11/8 and 12/6.
- Students are participating in their beginning of the year personal fitness assessment (One mile walk/jog/run, 60 second Push-ups & Curl ups, and sit and reach). - Motor Skill Units up to Winter Break are: throwing, catching, kicking, dribbling with feet, punting, trapping and
 passing. Students should have access to manipulative equipment at home for each skill using a variety of age appropriate equipment.

Magnet Musings

THE IB PYP PARENT - Sharing the Learner Profile at home

As I mentioned in the last newsletter, we are developing global citizens here at FWES. This is especially shown through the Learner Profile.

Principled:

Students who are PRINCIPLED have a sense of fairness and are honest with themselves and with others. They understand that sometimes there are rules and they follow them. They have an understanding of moral reasoning.

How can parents help to develop students who are Principled at home?

- Involve your child in deciding on the rules for a game or activity and then ensure that they stick to the ones that have been decided upon.
- Encourage your child to play games that involve teams. Discuss with your child the qualities of a team player. What sort of person would they want on their team?
- When your child wins a game insist that he or she is a well-mannered winner. They might thank their opponent or shake hands with them if it's appropriate.
- When playing a game, don't change the rules or let your child win. Being a gracious loser is just as important as being a good winner.
- Use the learner profile language when discussing home rules.

Reflective

Students who are REFLECTIVE know

what they are good at and what they're not. They make changes where they can. They give thoughtful consideration to their own learning and consider their personal strengths and weaknesses in a constructive manner.

How can parents help to develop students who are Reflective at home?

- Spend some time reviewing their assessments, interim reports or report card with them. They should have the opportunity to look at these documents and consider it as well. Discuss it with them and truly consider their thoughts on their strengths and areas for improvement.
- Consider the goals that your child could set for the next term. Make a list not only of the goals, but of specific actions that can be taken to achieve these goals. You might want to list action that your child will take independently as well as action parents will take to support them. For example, if one of the goals your child sets for herself is to improve her writing, her action might be to keep a journal and write in it for at least 10 minutes each night. As a parent, you might decide that the two of you will participate in shared writing, for 30 minutes each week and produce a book of narratives together.
- Consider non-academic strengths and areas for improvement. Set goals and create an action list.
