tions science unit. We were inquirers as we researched an animal, its habitat and adaptations. Through the study of food webs we explored consumers, producers and decomposers and their dependence on one another to survive. We used our existing knowledge of symmetry and showcased our creative talents to create symmetrical artwork of animals in their natural habitats. We showed curiosity as we observed fiddler crabs, African dwarf frogs and millipedes within the classroom and were reflective as we explained how these adaptations help them survive.

DID YOU KNOW?

• Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.

· Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read

Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days

Kindergarten Registration for 2018-19

- 2018/19 Kindergarten Registration begins on January 9, 2018 from 9:30am-3:00pm. Registrations are accepted daily between 10am-12noon.
- Incoming kindergarten students must be 5 years old by August 31, 2018.
- Parents should register their incoming kindergarten student at their base school and will need to provide their picture ID, their child's original birth certificate, and a current proof of residence (one of the following: light, water or gas bill, or a lease agreement signed within the past 60 days).
- A North Carolina Health Assessment form and up-todate immunization record is also required and must be presented by the first day of school.

Flu Prevention tips from Ms. Fernandez: Wake County recently experienced its second and third deaths of the 2017-2018 flu season. Flu is a serious, contagious disease. Each year in the U.S., <u>flu</u> <u>leads to</u> 12,000-56,000 hospitalizations and 140,000-710,000 deaths.

Several different types of flu move through communities across the country each flu season. This year's flu shots protect against three or four types of flu, depending on which vaccine you get. Whether or not you've had the flu this season, getting a flu shot can still help protect you from common types of flu. can get the flu, but you can help protect yourself and your family by following these simple tips.

Prevent the Flu

•Get vaccinated. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends everyone 6 months of age and older get a yearly flu vaccine. Flu vaccination can reduce flu illnesses, complications and deaths from flu. Get your shot now, because it may take up to two weeks for it to start protecting you.

•Stay away from people who are sick as much as possible.

•Wash your hands often with soap and water.

•Change your habits. Try not to touch your eyes, nose or mouth unless you have just washed your hands.

•Maintain other healthy habits such as getting plenty of sleep, being physically active, managing stress, drinking plenty of fluids and eating nutritious foods.

Don't Spread the Flu

•If you get sick, stay away from others as much as possible to keep from infecting them.

•Cough and sneeze into your elbow or a tissue. Throw the tissue in the trash and wash your hands.

•Wash your hands often with soap and water.

•Clean and disinfect surfaces and objects that may be contaminated with germs like the flu.

•Stay home until you are better. The CDC recommends that you stay home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone except to get medical care or for other necessities. Your fever should be gone without the use of fever-reducing medicine.

Know When to See a Doctor

•If you have symptoms of flu and are in a <u>high-risk group</u>, or are very sick or worried about your illness, contact your health care provider.

•If you have the <u>emergency warning</u> <u>signs</u> of flu sickness, you should go to the emergency room.

WAKE Up and Read ... This year Farmington Woods will be participating for our fourth year supporting this wonderful book donation program. **WAKE Up and Read** conducts a book drive each year to help build home libraries and make books readily available to children who need them. Through the book drive, every child at 10 high-need elementary schools and 20 childcare centers can choose 10 books and keep them for their home libraries.. <u>As a school</u> <u>we will be collecting books from January 20th - March 3rd</u>. This year our goal at Farmington Woods is to collect 2,500 books to donate. This is approximately 3 books from each student. To help make this easy, Mrs. Grice or Mrs. Wilson will stand at the front of the school to collect books in the carpool lane the week of February 5th - 8th. Books can always be

dropped off in the Inquiry Center or in the front office. Look for those books to donate and bring them in.

- Books must be new or gently used and appropriate for children birth 12.
- Gently used books should not be damaged by mold, water, or fire, and should not show signs of discoloration or age.
