FWES Visual Arts Updates

The IB philosophy is very supportive of the arts as it encourages students to think creatively, ask questions, and make connections. The four components of the art program: **art production**, **art history**, **art criticism**, **and aesthetics**; complement the IB philosophy.

- Kindergartners used paint to capture themselves on paper as they developed self-portraits inspired by the artist, Frida Khalo.
- First graders worked with the theme, "Cultures and Customs". Students became familiar with paper techniques as well as form while creating a 3-D paper mask.
- Second graders looked at the artist, Faith Ringgold and her book, "Tar Beach" for inspiration in a class quilt design. The students created a quilt design using shape, line, and pattern.
- Third graders will be looking closely at the artist, Pablo Picasso and creating Cubist style self-portraits.
- Fourth graders Students created a Clay fossils to connect with their transdisciplinary theme: How the World Works. You will see this amazing work in the showcase very soon !
- Fifth graders responded to Andy Warhol's style of Pop art. Students created self-portraits using the elements of line and color and the principles of variety and repetition.
- Students who participated in creating original compositions for the PTA Reflections program will receive their artwork back this month. The following students who placed at the County level will be announced on the morning news. Stay tuned!

The Buzz on Inquiry Units

IB/PYP structures curriculum based learning into units of Inquiry throughout the year. Each Unit is planned to create opportunities for students to explore and personalize their learning of the curriculum content. Student guestions are integrated into the learning to make important connections and rele-



vance for the students. Each unit has a summative assessment developed to support student learning and often includes an opportunity for students to share their newfound understanding and research of their personal questions related to the content.

2nd Grade Inquiry into How the World Works-Weather Watchers

Second grade students just completed a six week unit focusing on the Central Idea: Systems and patterns of the Earth are used to make predictions and draw conclusions. We ended our unit with creating an Extreme Weather stop motion movie...using the same technique from the "Lego Movie" and also a Green Screen Weather Report...using the same technique as meteorologists on TV.



This technology filled end of unit project was an exciting and engaging experience for our 2nd grade students. Students were interested in various extreme weather topics ie. tornadoes, hurricanes, blizzards, drought, and floods. Once they had their topic then they worked in teams to build a movie plan which is a screen by screen sketch. The goal of the stop motion movie was to show how that weather moves and changes. On production day students used ipads and a mixture of independently created materials and pre made printed clip art to create their stop motion movie.

Lights, Camera, Action! Some students also completed a Green Screen Weather Report. Students worked in groups and independently to write a weather report. This would then later be read in front of a Green Screen and recorded via an ipad. The completed video shows the students reporting live from their weather scene and sharing information about an extreme weather topic and includes current weather conditions, weather tools used to determine weather conditions, and how to stay safe in their extreme weather.
