EOG Testing Schedule

This year 3rd grade students will take Reading and Math EOG online and 5th graders will take Science online. All other tests will be administered paper and pencil. Attendance is critical!! Testing materials will be distributed as the bell rings at 9:15. Late students will not be permitted to enter the class and will have to take their EOG test on a make-up day.

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EOG Basics

The NC End Of Grade test series is designed to assess a student's proficiency with grade level curriculum standards. Students will be testing on reading and math skills; and science (5th grade only).

Scoring: *Unlike report cards*, student performance on the End Of Grade tests will range from 1 -5. Students who score a level 1 or 2 are not considered proficient in that academic area. Students who score a 3 will have demonstrated the ability to move to the next grade level. Students who score a level 4 or 5 on the EOG will be considered proficient and on track to being college and career ready.

Preparing: Students should get a good night sleep each night before EOG to be rested and ready for the test. Students need to arrive to school on time each day. Students who are tardy will not be admitted into a testing setting and will have to take it on a make-up day.
