IN-STATE SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

The NC State Carrier/Bryant Dependent Scholarship has been established to provide scholarship support for the children of permanent employees of an authorized Carrier/Bryant dealer in North or South Carolina who demonstrate financial need as determined by the FAFSA. The NC State Cross & Chalice J. Smith Capel Scholarship has been established to provide scholarship support for the children of permanent employees of Capel. To apply, go online at <https://ncsu.academicworks.com/opportunities/31>. Deadline: April 26, 2019.

The NC State Family Scholarship has been established to provide need-based scholarship assistance to full-time first-degree undergraduate students enrolled at NC State whose parents are permanent full-time employees of NC State University. The value of this scholarship varies depending upon the student's need for financial assistance and availability of funds. In addition to financial need, criteria such as academic performance, motivation, and leadership potential may also be considered in selecting recipients. Eligible students must apply for this scholarship annually, and may be considered for funding for no more than four academic years (or eight semesters). To demonstrate financial need, applicants must complete and submit a 2013-43 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), available at www.fafsa.gov, and request that the results be released to NC State (school code 002972). High school students who commit to teach in STEM or special education in our public schools will receive a \$33,000 scholarship (\$8,250 per year) for up to four years. NON-SCHOOL SPECIFIC SCHOLARSHIPS

Blacks at Microsoft (BAM) Scholarships are offered to outstanding black high-school seniors who are interested in pursuing careers in technology. High-school seniors of African descent may apply, including African American, African, or Ethiopian. Applicants must plan to pursue a bachelor's degree in engineering, computer science, computer information systems, or a business program such as finance, business administration, or marketing. Students must have a GPA of 3.3 or above and demonstrate financial need. Two scholarships are awarded. Scholarships are renewable up to four years of college. Ideal candidates will have a passion for technology and demonstrate leadership qualities through extracurricular activities at school or volunteer work in their communities. Recipients must attend a four-year college or university in the Fall immediately following high school graduation. The scholarship is offered by Microsoft and is focused on supporting the continued growth and development of black employees at Microsoft Corporation. The deadline for this scholarship is

Seniors interested in having a “gap” year before going on to college: Broughton has been asked to nominate seniors for the Congress-Bundestag Vocational Youth Exchange Program. The Program is a special work/study program for recently-graduated U.S. high school students to spend a gap year in Germany. The scholarship offers 18-19 year olds the opportunity to learn the German language and culture, live with a host family, make life-long friends, and undertake internships in their fields of interest. Participants are required to bring between \$500-\$550 a month for spending money. A financial aid package may be available to help a well-deserving student with personal spending money, if needed in order to participate. All participants will receive two months of intensive language preparation following their arrival in Germany before being assigned to their permanent host family and school.

Diabetes Scholars Foundation Scholarship Program. The Foundation makes scholarships available to incoming freshmen seeking a higher education at an accredited four year university, college, technical or trade school. The scholarships recognize students who are actively involved in the diabetes community, who have high academic performance, who participate in community and/or extra-curricular activities and who have demonstrated that they are successfully managing the challenges of living with diabetes. Gloria Barron Prize for Young Heroes is open to U.S. and Canadian students age 8 through 18. The prize is awarded to students who have done an extraordinary service project that has benefited the community or the environment. Up to 25 students will be awarded prizes. The Barron Prize recognizes these young people as heroes because they have accomplished something on their own with a heartfelt desire to change another person's life forever, or make the world a safer, healthier and cleaner place to live. Prize money can be used for furthering their education or funding their project. Students must be nominated by someone who has good knowledge of their project, such as teachers, librarians, school counselors, youth service officials, and religious leaders. Projects must be the student's own work and cannot be part of a school or other assignment. Students nominated are those who are generous of nature and truly want to do something extraordinary to help others. The award was named in honor of Gloria Barron, a teacher from Boulder, Colorado who always encouraged her family and others to make a positive difference in the world. Gloria's quiet heroism led her to create a nature museum at the Colorado School for the Blind where students could learn by touching. It was her quiet heroism

that inspired her son to name the scholarship after his mother, his hero. The deadline for this scholarship is April 15, 2019, and the award amount is usually \$5,000. For more details, visit www.barronprize.org

Historically Underrepresented Groups Scholarship (HUGS) is open to students who are members of historically underrepresented minorities majoring in archaeology. The scholarships are offered to minority archaeology students to help them complete their education and prepare for a career in archaeology and heritage management. The scholarship is open to underrepresented groups, including African American, Hispanic/Latino, Asian American, and other non-European minorities. The scholarship can be used for a field school, to volunteer on a project directed by a professional archaeologist, or to receive other forms of archaeological training in the summer. A total of three HUGS awards will be awarded to undergraduate and graduate students. Applicants must be enrolled in an accredited university in the United States or Canada, or if outside the United States, a university with equivalent accreditation. The scholarship is overseen by the Minority Scholarships Committee of the Society For American Archaeology (SAA). The Minority Scholarships Committee was established in 2010 to administer the Scholarship Fund and oversee scholarship application and awards. The first Scholarships were awarded in 2015. The SAA Minority Scholarship Fund is sustained by individual donations and book royalty donations, as well as corporate partnerships. The deadline for this scholarship is January 31, 2019, and the award amount is usually \$3,000. The [Microsoft DisAbility Scholarship](#) is intended to empower and enable high school students with disabilities to (a) go to college, (b) realize the impact technology has on the world, and (c) target a career in the technology industry. This non-renewable \$5000 scholarship will be paid to the recipient's Financial Aid Office by the Seattle Foundation on behalf of the DisAbility Employee Resource Group (ERG) at Microsoft. All candidates must be high school students living with a disability who plan to attend a 2 to 4 year University or College program, and have a cumulative 3.0+ GPA or equivalent. In addition, applicants must declare a major in engineering, computer science, computer information systems, legal or in business that are approved (i.e. paralegal, pre-law, finance, business administration, or marketing) and demonstrate leadership at school and/or in the community. National Co-op Scholarship Program. The program will award 155 merit scholarships to seniors who are pursuing a college cooperative education program at one of the following schools: Drexel University, Johnson & Wales University, Kettering University, Rochester Institute of Technology, University of Cincinnati, University of Toledo, and Wentworth Institute of Technology. *National Independent Automobile Dealers Association Scholarship is open to high school seniors who are planning to attend college. Students with high academic records are invited to apply for the scholarship. Four scholarships are awarded each year. Students residing in any of the 50 U.S. states may apply and use the scholarship money to attend any institution they want. Applicants will be selected based on transcripts of grades and ACT and SAT scores. The scholarships are offered through the National Independent Automobile Dealers Association Foundation, the non-profit, charitable arm of the National Independent Automobile Dealers Association (NIADA). The NIADA was founded in 1946 and serves professional auto dealers across the country with industry education and legislative support for the motor vehicle industry. To apply, students need to submit a completed application and include a high school transcript, ACT or SAT scores, and up to 5 letters of recommendation. They must also answer an essay question in 1200 words or less. The deadline for this

North Carolina High School Athletic Association JERRY MCGEE ENDOWED STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP: Awarded to two senior year high school student-athletes from North Carolina High School Athletic Association member schools each year. This award is unique because it honors both male and female student-athletes who have distinguished themselves by overcoming adversity and returned to excel beyond expectations in their scholastic athletic sport(s). North Carolina High School Athletic Association WILLIAM BRADSHAW MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP: To provide scholarship support to an outstanding African American, American Indian/Alaska Native* and/or Asian Pacific Islander American**, or Hispanic American student-athlete participating on a sanctioned varsity team at a North Carolina High School Athletic Association member school. Award Process: One male and one female from each of the eight regions will be selected to receive a \$750 scholarship each to further their education. From the pool of sixteen (16) regional winners, one male and female will be selected as overall state winners and receive an additional \$1,000 each. North Carolina High School Athletic Association TONY CULLEN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: To provide scholarship support for one senior male high school student athlete participating on the varsity level lacrosse team at a North Carolina High School Athletic Association member high school. Project Yellow Light is open to high school juniors and seniors, and undergraduate college students. Applicants may receive a scholarship by submitting a video or billboard on the dangers of distracted driving. Project Yellow Light is a scholarship that was created in 2007 in honor of a young man named Hunter Garner from Fredericksburg, Virginia, who died in a car accident at the age of 16. The scholarship was created by his parents and sister to remember Hunter and help students across the nation, regardless of grades or athletic ability, to attend college. To enter, students will submit a video of 25 seconds or 55 seconds that persuades teens to exercise safe driving habits. First, second, and third-place winners will be chosen in two categories, one for high school students, and one for college students. Applicants must be a high school junior or senior or a full-time college student to participate. In addition, the winning video will be used in a national Ad Council public service announcement (PSA). The scholarship has gained national attention since its beginning and has reached thousands of teens. The deadline for this scholarship is March 1, 2019 for billboard entries and April 1, 2019 for video entries, and the award amount is usually \$1,000 - \$5,000. Virtual Business Scholarship is available to high school juniors and seniors majoring in business, finance or marketing. The scholarship is open to all eligible students in the U.S. Applicants for this scholarship must be nominated by their teachers. Students are chosen based on their academic performance and interest in the use of technology. Students must be outstanding performers in their area of study to be eligible for a scholarship. In addition to a teacher nomination, students who apply for the scholarship must be able to articulate what they have learned from their technology experiences in the areas of business, marketing or personal finance. The scholarship is offered by Knowledge Matters, a Massachusetts based organization that publishes simulation-based business and personal finance curriculums for high schools. A grant from the U.S. Department of Education made the establishment of the organization possible in 1997. Since then, over a million students

have benefited from their programs throughout 5,000 high schools across the nation. The purpose of the scholarship is to provide financial support for students to continue their education. The deadline for this scholarship is APRIL 1, 2019, and the award amount is usually \$2,000. For more details, visit www.knowledgematters.com/scholarships/
