IN-STATE SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

The **NC State George & Reba Worsley Finance and Business Scholarship** has been established to provide scholarship support for the children of permanent employees in the Finance and Business division at NC State University. Students can be enrolled at the graduate or undergraduate level, but must be enrolled full time for consideration. Awards are made based on financial need, with academic merit as a second criterion. Eligible students must apply for this scholarship annually, and may be considered for funding for no more than four academic years (or eight semesters). To demonstrate financial need, applicants must complete and submit a *Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)*, available at www.fafsa.gov, and request that the results be released to NC State (school code 002972). Applicants are strongly encouraged to complete the FAFSA by March 1, 2019. To apply, go online at <https://studentservices.ncsu.edu/your-money/financial-aid/types/scholarships/>. Scholarship applications should be submitted to the Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid **by May 1, 2019**

The **North Carolina Central University Alumni Association** offers several “National Alumni Scholarships” to students at NCCU. The scholarships vary in amount and may be renewable for up to four years. Recipients of these awards are designated “National Alumni Scholars.” Though the majority of the National Alumni Scholarship awards made annually will be to incoming freshman students, applications are acceptable from any student regardless of classification or academic interest. DAR Scholarships for Political Science, History, Government and Economics are open to both undergraduate and graduate students pursuing degrees in the areas of political science, history, government and economics. Four different scholarships are available.

Eligible students must apply for each scholarship separately. They include:

1. **The Dr. Aura-Lee A. and James Hobbs Pittenger American History Scholarship** - awarded to graduating high school students who will pursue an undergraduate degree with a concentrated study of a minimum of 24 credit hours in American History and American Government.
2. **The Lucinda Beneventi Findley History Scholarship** - awarded to two graduating high school seniors who have demonstrated advanced interest in history and are planning to major in or pursue the study of history in a full-time accredited college or university in the United States.

Applicants must have a GPA of 3.25 and be full-time students attending an accredited college or university in the U.S. Some scholarships are renewable; students must maintain the required minimum in order to apply. All scholarships are offered through the Daughters of the American Revolution, a membership service organization for women who are directly descended from a person involved in the United States' efforts towards independence. The non-profit group was founded in 1890 and works to promote historic preservation, education, and patriotism. **The deadline for this scholarship is February 15, 2019, and the award amount is usually \$2,000 - \$5,000. Electronic Security Association Scholarship. The Electronic Security Association (ESA) is pleased to announce the 2019 ESA Youth Scholarship Program. Applicants must be at least 15 years of age and not older than 20. He or she must be a graduating high school senior who will receive a diploma from an accredited high school, located within the state where they apply. Applicants must be accepted for admission to an accredited college or university, matriculating the following year. Each eligible student must have a father, mother or natural guardian who meets the following qualifications: a. The student's school must be located in the state where the parent is a full-time active employee OR within a 100-mile radius of where the parent is a full-time active employee. b. Parent must be a full-time paid member of the police or sheriff's department or fire department. Parent/guardian may also be a volunteer member of a fire department. c. Parent or guardian must be an active duty police officer, firefighter, paramedic, or EMT (public sector). Children of administrative staff do not qualify. d. Children of DHS, FBI and other Federal employees do not qualify. e. Children of reserve officers, part-time sheriff's deputies and retired, deceased or disabled employees do not qualify. A GPA of 3.5 or above is required. The scholarship is open to all US and non-US residents. Applicants may apply by completing an application, including proof of attendance from the college enrolled in, and a letter of recommendation from the faculty staff or professor. Scholarships are for full-time students pursuing post-secondary education (two- or four-year degrees only) at any accredited college, university, community college, or trade school. There are no limitations on area of study. Scholarship awards can be used for tuition and fees and will range from \$1,000 to \$10,000 annually, renewable for up to four years with total awards not to exceed \$20,000. In order to receive renewal payments, each scholarship recipient must demonstrate ongoing community involvement and maintain a 3.0 cumulative GPA. Scholarship recipients will be selected based on demonstrated financial need, community involvement and leadership, and academic merit. The \$1,000 non-renewable scholarship is awarded to a Broughton senior who has demonstrated outstanding character and personal integrity and is planning to pursue post-secondary education. Any senior with a 2.5+ GPA may apply. Applicants may be nominated by seniors, parents, faculty and staff, or seniors may nominate themselves. Deadline: April 12, 2018.

Samsung American Legion Scholarship is available to **high school juniors** who attend an American Legion state program and are a direct descendent of a wartime veteran who was on active duty during one of the periods of war. Applicants can be a child, grandchild, great grandchild, or a legally adopted child of a wartime U.S. military veteran. Candidates must be high school juniors who attend The American Legion Boys State or American Legion Auxiliary Girls State program. U.S. veterans include those who have served in the following wars: World War I, World War II, Korean War, Vietnam, Lebanon/Grenada, Panama, and Persian Gulf. Scholarships may be applied toward tuition, books, fees, and room and board. Winners are selected according to academic record, involvement in school and community service. The scholarship is supported by electronics leader Samsung who endowed a scholarship fund of \$5 million to be administered by The American Legion in 1996. Scholarship recipients include ten National Scholars, ten National Runners-Up, and finalists. All receive various amounts of awards up to \$10,000. To date, the Samsung American Legion Scholarship has awarded more than \$5.3 million to approximately 1,970 applicants. Scholarships are due no later than the first day of a participant's American Legion Boys State or American Legion Auxiliary Girls State program. All applications must be submitted using the online application system by 11:59PM on this day. , **and the award amount is usually \$1,250 - \$10,000. SEG[Society of Exploration Geophysicists]Foundation Scholarships encourage the study of geophysics and related geosciences. The SEG Foundation offers a range of [different scholarship opportunities](#). SEG Scholarships are based on merit and applicants must be intending to pursue a college curriculum directed toward a career in applied geophysics or a closely related field such as geosciences, physics, geology, or earth and environmental sciences. [Scholarships](#) range from \$500 to \$14,000 USD per academic year; average awards are approximately \$2,500. There are approximately 75 different scholarships. Half are unrestricted scholarships; the rest have specific donor intentions that include consideration for major/minor, university, career intention, involvement in student activities, year of study, or particular research field. State Employee Association of North Carolina [SEANC] Scholarship Program. Children of state employees whose parents are members of SEANC are eligible to apply for a SEANC Scholarship. [Note: This is a membership organization, not to be confused with the State Employees Credit Union, or with employment by the State of North Carolina.] Some scholarships are merit-based, and others are based on FINANCIAL NEED. Applications are available online at www.seanc.org/scholarship from January to April each year. Applications must be postmarked by **April 15, 2019**.

TheDream.US Scholarship Program offers scholarship awards to first-time college students who have a financial need and are [undocumented immigrants](#). It is specifically for students whose undocumented immigration status meets the qualifications for Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA). DACA was approved by President Obama in 2012 which defers any deportation action for undocumented young people who came to the U.S. as children and have pursued education or military service in the U.S. Students may be either already DACA approved or may apply for DACA approval if they believe they are eligible. [Eligible students must be planning to attend participating colleges in New York City, Miami, Washington D.C., El Paso, Rio Grande Valley](#), and online and pursuing an associate's or bachelor's degree. They must have a grade point average of 2.5 or above. The scholarship may be used for tuition, books, and other college fees and expenses. The scholarship is offered by TheDream.US, a Washington D.C.-based non-profit organization that provides college scholarships to highly motivated undocumented immigrants who would otherwise not be able to afford a college education. The goal of the organization is to enable 2,000 eligible students over the next ten years to realize their dream of a college education and joining the U.S. workforce. **The deadline for this scholarship is January 31, 2019, and the award amount is usually \$25,000. Unigo [a free scholarship matching service with a database of over 2.4 million scholarships] is offering the **Superpower \$2,500 Scholarship**. Applicants must be 13 years of age or older and respond (200 words max): "Which superhero or villain would you want to change places with for a day and why?" Deadline: March 31, 2019. Unigo.com Fifth Month Scholarship is open to students age 13 and older who plan to enroll in an accredited post-secondary institution of higher education in the Fall immediately following graduation from high school. All candidates must be citizens of the U.S. or District of Columbia. Students may enter the scholarship competition by submitting an essay of 250 words or less on the subject of the number 5 and why that number is important to them. Since the deadline for this scholarship is the 5th month, or May, students can use humor and creativity to create their essays based on the number 5. All essays must be the original work of the applicant. Essays will be judged by writing ability, creativity, originality, and overall excellence, in addition to correct spelling and grammar. Only one scholarship is awarded per year. **The deadline for this scholarship is May 31, 2019, and the award**

amount is usually \$1,500. Apply at

The **Walter J Travis Memorial Scholarship Program**, offered by the Walter J. Travis Society, Inc., awards a limited number of academic scholarships to honor the accomplishments and contributions of Walter J. Travis in his career as an amateur golfer, golf course architect, turf grass expert, golf journalist, golf magazine founder and editor, and golf equipment innovator. You are eligible to be an applicant if you are enrolled as a full-time student in a two- or four-year college/university and pursuing a career in one of the following professions: **sports journalist, with a special interest in golf, golf course architecture, golf course turf grass management/greens superintendent; professional golf management; and if you are an excellent college/university amateur golfer whose career goal is in a field other than the aforementioned professions.** You **must** include a letter from your college/university verifying that you are, or will be, a full-time matriculated student for the 2019-2020 school year.
