IN-STATE SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP

UNC-Chapel Hill. The **Light on the Hill Society Scholarship** will award ten (10) scholarships to African-American students who will enroll at UNC Chapel Hill for fall 2019.

- Two \$2,000 Julius Peppers scholarships, renewable up to three years
- Eight \$2,500 LOTH scholarships, one-time awards

This is a one-year scholarship in the amount of \$2,000. Applicants must rank in top 20% of class, have a minimum SAT score of 1220 or ACT composite score of 25, be of good character and demonstrate participation in extra-curricular activities. Alpha Delta Kappa/Alpha Theta Chapter Eunice Riggins Memorial Scholarship is open to any young woman who is currently graduating from an accredited high school in North Carolina and who expects to enroll in a four-year college or university in North Carolina next fall. This is a one-year scholarship in the amount of \$2,000. Applicants must rank in top 10% of class, have a minimum SAT score of 1220 or ACT composite score of 25, be of good character and show participation in extra-curricular activities. Financial need is not the primary consideration. See Mr. Rudder in the Guidance Resource Center for an application. Deadline: February 1, 2019.

Alpha Delta Kappa/Alpha Theta Chapter Mary Rose Mills-Linda Rankin Memorial Scholarship is open to any student who is currently graduating from an accredited high school in North Carolina and who expects to enroll in a four-year college or university next fall, and who meets eligibility requirements. This is a one-year scholarship in the amount of \$2,000. Applicants must rank in the top 10% of class, have a minimum SAT score of 1290 or ACT composite score of 27, be of good character and show participation in extra-curricular activities. Financial need is not the primary consideration. See Mr. Rudder in the Guidance Resource Center for an application. Deadline: February 1, 2019. . .

The **North Carolina American Indian Scholarship Fund** will assist American Indian students in obtaining higher education by providing scholarships to selected applicants each year. The number of scholarships awarded will be determined by the funds available for distribution each year. Scholarships are for full-time students pursuing post-secondary education (two- or four-year degrees only) at any accredited college, university, community college, or trade school. Applicants must be enrolled in a state- or federally-recognized tribe, demonstrate sustained involvement in the American Indian Community, have family residency in the state and be currently enrolled or planning to enroll in a post-secondary institution in the state of North Carolina. Scholarship recipients will be selected based on 1) Commitment to and plan to give back to the American Indian Community in the future; 2) Involvement in extracurricular, volunteer, and community activities, 3) Demonstrated financial need; and 4) Academic merit and performance. Individual awards will be valued at \$1,000 per year, renewable for up to four years, for a maximum award of \$4,000 per student and can be used for tuition, required fees and textbooks. . Payments will be sent annually and the student must maintain at least a 2.0 cumulative grade point average and submit a short report at the conclusion of each semester in order to receive renewal payments. AMVETS Scholarships are offered to veterans, active duty military members, guard and reserves and their children or grandchildren. Seven different scholarships are awarded each year. Scholarships are based on financial need and merit. Applicants must be U.S. citizens. The scholarships provide financial assistance for veterans, service members, and their families, including children or grandchildren of veterans who are deceased. Applicants must attend accredited U.S. schools. Applicants may attend school either part-time or full-time. They may be undergraduate or graduate students enrolled in educational programs that will lead to a certificate or degree, including online educational programs. AMVETS (American Veterans) is a non-profit organization that was formed by U.S. World War II veterans and is chartered by U.S. Congressional Law. The organization works to provide for the needs of U.S. veterans and their families, including job training, employment assistance, educational assistance, and other programs and services that improve the quality of life for veterans and their families. **The deadline for this scholarship is April 30, 2019 and the award amount is usually \$1,000 - \$4,000. Broughton Alumni Association Scholarship. This is a grant of \$3,000 per year for four years during which the recipient is enrolled at an accredited secondary school, college, university, or other institution of higher learning. Only Broughton students with outstanding records of scholarship, service to Broughton, character & citizenship receive this award. The grant for each year is dependent upon verification of enrollment for the fall semester to the Scholarship Committee. Broughton Alumni Association's Mial Williamson Scholarship. The Mial Williamson Award is a one-time grant of \$4,000 to a deserving graduating senior who embodies the spirit and character of Mial Williamson, a member of the class of 1949. During Mial's years at Broughton, he served the school energetically. Among other activities, he was President of the Student Council and co-captain of the basketball team. In addition, service to Broughton, character, citizenship and scholarship will be considered. The **Congressional Black Caucus Spouses Heineken USA Performing Arts Scholarship** provides financial assistance to students in performing arts. Scholarships are awarded every year to gifted and talented students pursuing careers in music, drama and other arts vocations. The scholarship is open to high school seniors and college freshman, sophomores, juniors and seniors. Applicants must be enrolled full-time at a U.S. accredited college or university. They must have a grade point average of 2.5 or above, demonstrate leadership abilities, and be active in community service. All applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents. Up to ten students each year are awarded scholarships. Eligible students may major in drama, music, dance, opera, marching bands, and other musical ensembles. To apply, students may submit an application online and include a cover letter about themselves in under 1,000 words, two letters of recommendation, a resume and one visual recording sample of their talents and skills. The scholarship is offered by the Congressional Black Caucus Foundation (CBCF), founded in 1976, in partnership with Heineken USA. The Washington D.C.-based organization is dedicated to global advancement of African-Americans. **The deadline for this scholarship is April 15, 2019, and the award amount is usually \$3,000. Digital Privacy Scholarship. The purpose of this scholarship is to help you understand why you should be cautious about what you post on the Internet. You must be a high school freshman, sophomore, junior, or senior or a current or entering college or graduate school student of any level. Home schooled students are also eligible. There is no age limit. You must also be a U.S. citizen or legal resident. The **Kristina Flores Overcoming All Odds Scholarship** is open to high school students planning to attend college, and current college freshmen and sophomores. The scholarship is for students who have overcome big obstacles that might have prevented them from pursuing their education. To apply, students must submit a 1000-word essay on how they overcame a significant adversity in order to complete or continue their schooling. In addition to the essay, two letters are required from others who can comment on how the applicant overcame significant adversity that might have otherwise prevented them from continuing their education. The scholarship is open to all students attending a vocational or trade school, or a traditional college or university. All majors are eligible for the scholarship. The scholarship is offered by True North Recovery Services and named after Kristina Flores, who died tragically at the age of 23. True North Recovery Services is an outpatient alcohol and drug treatment center located in Encinitas, California. **The deadline for this scholarship is April 1, 2019, and the award amount is usually \$1,000. Mary Moy Quan Ing Memorial Journalism Scholarship. This scholarship is administered by the Asian American Journalists Association [AAJA] and is a \$2,000 scholarship to an Asian high school senior who is enrolling in college and pursuing a journalism career. North Carolina Alpha Delta Kappa Student Achievement Scholarship administered by the North Carolina Community Foundation [www.nccommunityfoundation.org.] This scholarship is designed for students with grades and college admissions scores falling within ranges to be determined by the Community Foundation of NC in January, 2018. Applicants are also judged based on their service to school, community, and church as well as their integrity and leadership potential. SABR's **Jerry Malloy Negro Baseball League Scholarship** is open to high school seniors who plan to attend college and work towards a college degree. Two scholarships will be awarded to the students who write the most compelling essay on a topic pertaining to Negro League baseball. Eligible students must have a grade point average of 2.5 by the end of their junior year in high school. They may apply for the scholarship in their senior year provided they plan to attend a U.S. accredited college or university. To apply, students should be knowledgeable about the history of black baseball as they will be required to write a 1,200-word essay on a topic that relates to the history of the Negro League. Applications will be judged according to student academic performance, quality and depth of essay writing, and involvement in school, community and church activities. The scholarship rewards students who excel in school and have a strong interest in the Negro Leagues and baseball in general. Since 2007, the Society for American Baseball Research (SABR) Negro Leagues Committee has awarded scholarships to high school seniors pursuing higher education. SABR was organized in 1971 for the purpose of

researching the history of baseball. The non-profit, member-based organization includes people from around the world who all share a passion for baseball.

The deadline for this scholarship is April 15, 2019, and the award amount is usually \$2,500. For more details, visit www.sabr.org/malloy.
