IN-STATE SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

The **North Carolina Central University Raleigh/Wake Alumni Association** offers several scholarships to high school seniors interested in attending North Carolina Central University in the Fall of 2019. Applicants must be a Wake County resident, have at least a 2.5 GPA and a SAT score of 900+. Financial need is not the primary criteria in determining recipients for the award. SCHOLARSHIPS OFFERED ON A MONTHLY/QUARTERLY BASIS

NON-SCHOOL SPECIFIC SCHOLARSHIPS

AABE Scholarship. The North Carolina Chapter of the **American Association of Blacks in Energy** offers scholarships ranging from \$1,000-\$3,000 to underrepresented minorities [African Americans, Hispanics, Native Americans] seeking financial assistance for post-secondary education. Applicants must have a 3.0+ GPA and be planning to major in business, engineering, environment studies, mathematics or physical sciences [astronomy, chemistry, geology, mineralogy, meteorology, physics]. Careers in Conservation (CIC) Scholarship Program.

Scholarships are awarded up to \$5K per student per school year. (The program typically awards 10-15 scholarships per year of \$1,000.)

Eligibility:

1. Must be NC resident
2. Attend a NC college
3. Achieve academic excellence in high school or in undergraduate studies
4. Selection Committee considers superior academic accomplishments, extracurricular activities, honors and achievements obtained
5. Priority given to undergrads demonstrating a clear commitment to a BS degree in natural resource management or closely related fields
6. Additional consideration given to students who have completed at least 50% of their required college degree credit hours
7. Eligibility influenced by amount of scholarships previously awarded and any demonstrated financial hardships
8. College students must submit an official transcript of all college courses completed by the date of application.

High school transcripts are acceptable if the student has not completed a semester of college as of Jan. 31, 2019.

Fund II Foundation UNCF STEM Scholars Program is open to African American students pursuing careers in the STEM fields—science, technology, engineering and mathematics. The Scholars Program includes scholarships, internships, mentoring and other tools to help African American students reach their goals. The scholarship is open to African American high school seniors planning to attend college as freshmen and will cover up to 5 years of college. Applicants must have a GPA of 3.0 or above and high academic performance in math and science. They must also have demonstrated financial need. To apply, students must complete all essays, include a description of all student leadership and community service activities, and send two letters of recommendation. Eligible majors include Biological/Life Sciences, Physics, Chemistry, Computer Science/Engineering, Engineering (industrial, electrical, mechanical, chemical), and Mathematics. The Fund II Foundation UNCF STEM Scholars Program is a \$48 million initiative aimed at addressing diversity gaps in the STEM fields. The scholars program was created as a pipeline that will prepare African American students for careers in technology and innovation. **The deadline for this scholarship is March 3, 2019, and the award amount is usually \$20,000. The **Hugh Morson Memorial Scholarship**, administered by Wells Fargo Bank and the Center for Scholarship Administration [CSA], is renewable for up to 3 consecutive additional years of undergraduate work, or until a bachelor's degree is awarded. Applicants must be high school seniors, a resident of the City of Raleigh, have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 on a weighted GPA scale, demonstrate academic achievement and financial need and attend an accredited, public or private, four-year college or university. Apply online at www.csascholars.org. Deadline: March 29, 2019.

Louie Family Foundation Scholarship is open to high school seniors planning to attend a U.S. accredited college or university. Qualifying students must demonstrate financial need, disabilities, have overcome great adversities in their lives, or whose parents are in the military. Students must have a grade point average of 3.4 or above, a SAT score of 1800, or a ACT score of 25. In addition, they must have outstanding personal achievements and leadership qualities demonstrated through helping their communities. Applicants may attend either a two-year or four-year college or university or vocational school in the U.S. The scholarship is sponsored by The Kim and Harold Louie Family Foundation which was established in 2005 by Betty B. Louie in honor of her parents. The scholarship is one of many foundation programs which assist the sick and disabled. Ms. Louie co-founded a company that is a leading provider of disability evaluation services. The foundation awards 25 scholarships a year to deserving students. **The deadline for this scholarship is February 28, 2019, and the award amount is usually \$4,000. The **Triangle Community Foundation** is now accepting scholarship applications for funding for the 2019-2020 academic year. Information and applications for the following scholarships are all available on the website, www.trianglecfc.org. Applicants will create a profile, upload completed application forms and required attachments, and will provide the names and email addresses of recommenders [if applicable]. Recommenders will be notified by email through the portal and will be asked to submit their recommendations online by each scholarship deadline. Official transcripts should be postmarked by the application deadline and mailed directly to Triangle Community Foundation, PO Box 12729, Durham, NC 27709.

- **Benjamin F. Ward Scholarship** provides financial assistance to graduating high school seniors in Durham, Orange, Wake, or Chatham counties intending to attend a NC college or university full-time. Recipients will be selected based on financial need and commitment to community service and involvement. Scholarships are valued at \$2,500 per academic year for up to four years for a total award of \$10,000. Deadline: February 28, 2019.
- **GlaxoSmithKline Opportunity Scholarship** is available to US citizens who are residents of Durham, Orange, or Wake County and have overcome significant adversity. Scholarships are valued at \$5,000 per year, renewable for up to four years, for a total award up to \$20,000. Recipients must attend a public state university or community college in North Carolina. Deadline: March 15, 2019.

- The **Achievement Scholarship for Refugees and Immigrants of Wake County** provides financial awards for refugee and immigrant high school seniors who reside in Wake County to continue their education in a post-secondary setting. The amount awarded per recipient can vary between \$1,000 and \$4,000 per academic year, and is renewable for up to 4 years. Deadline: March 31, 2019.
- The **North Carolina American Indian Fund Scholarship** assists American Indian students across the state in obtaining higher education by providing scholarships to pursue a 2- or 4-year undergraduate degree as a full-time student. Scholarships are valued at \$1,000 and students may reapply each year for additional funding. Deadline: May 1, 2019.
- The **Citrix Scholarship** is intended to reflect Citrix System’s commitment to increasing diversity in STEM fields by providing scholarships to **students attending NC Central University, Shaw University or St. Augustine’s University and majoring in STEM and/or computer science**. Individual awards will be valued at \$5,000 per year, renewable for up to 4 academic years, and can be used for tuition, fees, books, room and board, and one-time computer purchase at one of the three eligible schools. Deadline: June 1, 2019.

The **Woman's Club of Raleigh** offers the Ann Collins Scholarship, the Helen Graham Scholarship, and the Lois Fisher Scholarship valued at \$1,000 each to public school high school seniors who will be attending a North Carolina college or university. Priority is given to candidates who attend Athens Drive, Broughton, Enloe, Southeast or Wakefield High School. **The Scholarship Committee will present the winners during the June meeting. The award money will be sent to the college or university in the summer for the upcoming school year. Applications are available in the Guidance Resource Center [Room 1209]. Deadline: March 6, 2019.**
