## SCHOLARSHIPS OFFERED ON A MONTHLY/QUARTERLY BASIS

## NON-SCHOOL SPECIFIC SCHOLARSHIPS

American Legion Baseball Scholarship. This opportunity is open to all students who have played baseball for an American Legion team. To be eligible, students must be high school graduates and must secure a nomination from their team manager or head coach. This scholarship requires three recommendations. As you can imagine, these recommendations will be weighted very heavily in the scholarship selection process. Recommendations must be from your team coach or manager, an American Legion Post Commander or Adjutant, and a community leader (including, but not limited to a priest, teacher, principal, scout leader). Students must also include a photograph and a copy of their official high school transcript. Application consists of completing an essay of 500-1,000 words that describes how a small business has changed their life. The awards are funded by the NATAS foundation. Five scholarships are available. The 5 scholarships include:

**The Randy Falco Scholarship** — Awarded to a Hispanic or Latino student pursuing a career in any aspect of the television industry.

 $\textbf{The Jim McKay Memorial Scholarship} \ - \ \text{Awarded to a student pursuing a career in sports television}.$ 

**The Douglas W. Mummert Scholarship** – Awarded to a student pursuing a career in any aspect of the television industry, who has made a positive impact through community service.

**The Mike Wallace Memorial Scholarship** — Awarded to a student pursuing a career in television journalism. **The NATAS Trustees' Scholarship** — Awarded to a student pursuing a career in any aspect of the television industry.

The National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences is a professional association dedicated to the advancement of television and electronic media. The organization is best known for its Emmy Awards that recognize excellence in a number of categories. In addition to scholarships, NATAS also sponsors programs, seminars, and scholarships for high school and colleges in cities served by the organization's 19 local chapters. The organization was founded in 1955 and is located in New York City. The deadline for this scholarship is March 11, 2019, and the award amount is usually \$10,000.

North Carolina Farm Bureau's R. Flake Shaw Scholarship. This scholarship provides \$3,000 per year, renewable for four years, to 24 seniors who will be pursuing a degree for future employment in the field of agriculture. County Farm Bureaus may forward only one scholarship application from the county to North Carolina Farm Bureau for consideration as a scholarship recipient. No application will be considered if not signed by the county Farm Bureau president. Preference is given to Farm Bureau members. Applicants must have satisfactory grades, leadership potential, an evident understanding of the agricultural and/or agribusiness community, and demonstrated financial need. Four scholarships valued at \$1,000 per year for two years will be awarded to seniors who will be pursuing an associate degree in an agriculturally related field at a community college. The application must be returned to the Wake County Farm Bureau Office before March 4, 2019.

The Print & Graphics Scholarship Foundation offers **Graphic Communication Scholarships** valued up to \$5,000. Applicants must be pursuing a career in graphic communications, technology or management at a technical school or college in the U.S. Applicants may be a high school student or graduate and must be able to maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher.
