IN-STATE SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

Eight one-time \$2,500 Light on the Hill Society Scholarships and two renewable \$2,000 Light on the Hill Julius Peppers Scholarship will be awarded to a first-year undergraduate African-American male or female who has been admitted and plans to attend UNC-Chapel Hill beginning fall 2018. Recipients will be selected based on excellent academic achievement, strong community service involvement, outstanding leadership qualities and essay answers. Applications are available online at https://alumni.unc.edu/light-on-the-hill-society-scholarship/. Application deadline: 5pm (EDT), mARCH 3, 2019.

The RALEIGH-WAKE CHAPTER OF THE WINSTON-SALEM STATE UNIVERSITY NATIONAL ALUMNI ASSOCIATION awards two (2) \$1,000 scholarships annually to honor and continue the legacy of former chapter members. Each recipient will receive a one-time award for the academic year (\$500.00 per semester) for undergraduate study. Scholarship recipients must achieve a minimum 2.7 grade point average (GPA) the first semester to be awarded the second installment for the second semester. Additionally, the recipient must reside on campus the entire freshman year. Funds are sent to the university and credited to the recipient's account each semester. Funds must be applied toward tuition and fees. Applicants must also score at least 850 (composite) on the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT), or 18 on the American College Test (ACT). TEACHING SCHOLARSHIP

The **Muriel Brown Memorial Scholarship**, established 2017 by the Brown Family to honor the memory of Muriel Brown, retired Wake County Teacher in Early Childhood Education, is offered at **North Carolina Central University**. Applicants must be from Raleigh, have a 2.5+ GPA, SAT or equivalent test score of 900+, and planning to major in education [preferably Early Childhood Education]. Financial need is not the primary criteria in determining award recipients. This scholarship will be renewable annually as long as the recipient maintains a 3.0+ GPA and remains a student at NCCU. Bennett Place Support Fund's **William Vatavuk Scholarship**. A \$500 non-renewable scholarship awarded to a high school senior with a 3.0+ GPA planning to study history and/or Education in college. The \$500 monies must be put toward tuition, fees for lab studies, books and notebooks, computers and related media supplies, or other related supplies directly related to the pursuit of the diploma or degree. NON-SCHOOL SPECIFIC SCHOLARSHIPS

Blacks at Microsoft (BAM) Scholarships are offered to outstanding black high-school seniors who are interested in pursuing careers in technology. High-school seniors of African descent may apply (for example, African American, Caribbean, African, etc). Applicants must plan to pursue a bachelor's degree in engineering, computer science, computer information systems, or a business program such as finance, business administration, or marketing. Students must have a GPA of 3.3 or above and demonstrate financial need. Two scholarships are awarded. Scholarships are renewable up to four years of college. Ideal candidates will have a passion for technology and demonstrate leadership qualities through extracurricular activities at school or volunteer work in their communities. Recipients must attend a four-year college or university in the Fall immediately following high school graduation. The scholarship is offered by Microsoft and is focused on supporting the continued growth and development of black employees at Microsoft Corporation. National Hook-up of Black Women (NHBW) Scholarships are available to graduating high school seniors who plan to enroll in an accredited college or university in the fall after graduation. Two different scholarships are available. Candidates must have a GPA of 2.75 or above, and be involved in school and community activities; they must be able to demonstrated at least 100 hours of community service. Scholarships include the Dr. Arnita Young Boswell Scholarship, named after Dr. Arnita Young Boswell, a long time social worker and university professor, and the Dr. Frazier Sister-to-Sister Scholarship, named after Dr. Wynetta A. Frazier, who was the Assistant Director of Early Childhood Research and Intervention Programs, Department of Education, University of Illinois, Chicago, Illinois. To apply, candidates must complete and mail an application, along with a 450-500 word essay on the topic of community service. In addition, a recent transcript of grades, photo and two letters of recommendation are required. Applicants for the Dr. Wynetta A. Frazier Scholarship must be 21 years old or older. The Providian Medical Scholarship is offered twice a year and awards a \$500 scholarship. This scholarship is essay-based and deals with the healthcare field. Specifically students are asked to write a 1,500 word essay in response to the following prompt: Describe how medical equipment technology has changed the face of a college course and curriculum. Entries can also include a look toward the future and how this area of study will continue to evolve and advance. The scholarship committee will be assessing essays on originality, research, and quality of essay. Students of all intended majors are welcome to apply, but students interested in a medical or veterinary career are especially encouraged to apply. To be eligible students must be enrolled in high school, be at least 16 years old and must be maintaining a 3.0+ GPA. The application deadline for the Summer Scholarship is June 21, 2019. Completed applications should include: printed copy of your essay with your complete contact information on each page (full name, address, email address and phone number) and a statement or transcript showing your current cumulative GPA (unofficial transcripts are acceptable). Air Force ROTC scholarship recipients receive a nontaxable monthly stipend ranging from \$300-\$500 and an annual textbook allowance of \$900. Air Force ROTC scholarship are degree-specific and students must major in the field in which they are awarded a scholarship. The scholarship cycle begins early in May [applicant's Junior year in HS] and continues through early December of the applicant's senior year.
