# **In-State School Scholarships**

Appalachian State University offers the Seby Jones Scholarship for Wake County Students. The scholarship was established to support academically motivated students from Wake county. Students being considered for this scholarship should complete the application for admission to ASU and the scholarship application by November 15. Students eligible for this scholarship must be entering college for the first time and enroll as a full-time student. Applications will be emailed to students who qualify. ## **OUT-OF-STATE SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS**

Every year, **Boston University** welcomes about 25 outstanding students to the **Trustee Scholars Program**. Many of our current Scholars had perfect 4.0 grade point averages in high school, and most ranked in the top 1% of their class. However, students in the top 10% of their class are encouraged to apply for the scholarship. All Trustee Scholars receive a renewable scholarship covering full undergraduate tuition and mandatory fees for up to four years. Applicants must submit their application for admission and two Trustee Scholarship essays by December 1, 2018. Application instructions are available online at bu.edu/admissions/trustee.

Clemson National Scholars Discipline: General Merit-based Award: Approximately 10 students will be awarded scholarships covering the entire cost for attendance at Clemson. To be considered, applicants must complete both the online Clemson undergraduate admissions application and the online Calhoun Honors College application – including all supporting documentation – by December 15. The **Culinary Institute of America** Scholarship offerings vary by campus and programs. Twenty students will receive scholarships of up to \$20,000. 3.5+GPA required. Incoming students who have a demonstrated interest in food writing are eligible to apply for a \$2,000 M.F.K. Fisher Scholarship. Application requires an original essay of 500-700 words about a food memory. The CIA also encourages young culinarians to enter an original & imaginative recipe for leftover Thanksgiving turkey in order to win up to \$15,000 in scholarships in their Top Turkey Recipe Contest. #### **TEACHING SCHOLARSHIPS**

**Lenoir-Rhyne University** offers the LR Teaching Scholars Scholarship Program that provides scholarships of \$5,500 per year for four years to incoming freshmen. These funds are awarded in addition to all other financial aid for which students may already qualify. LR's Teaching Scholars will be selected on the basis of their potential for academic excellence as a university student and a sincere desire to serve others through a career in teaching. Prospective Teacher Scholarship-Loan Program. This competitive, merit-based scholarship-loan program is available to students with a non-weighted 2.5+ GPA who have chosen to pursue teaching as a career. The award is \$2,500 per year for the first two years of full-time enrollment and \$4,000 per year for the junior and senior years. Recipients must agree to work full-time as a teacher in NC one year for every year of funding or repay the loan in cash at a rate of 10% interest. Barbara Lotze Scholarships for Future Teachers. The American Association of Physics Teachers Executive Board offers scholarships for future **high school physics teachers**. These scholarships, supported by an endowment funded by Barbara Lotze, are available only to U.S. citizens attending U.S. schools. Undergraduate students enrolled, or planning to enroll, in physics teacher preparation curricula and high school seniors entering such programs are eligible. Successful applicants receive a stipend of up to \$2,000 and a complimentary AAPT Student Membership for one year. The scholarship may be granted to an individual for each of four years. Students who meet the following criteria are eligible to apply for the Barbara Lotze Scholarship for Future Teachers. Applicants must declare their intent to prepare for, and engage in, a career in physics teaching at the high school level and must, at the time the scholarship funds are received by the student, be:

- an undergraduate student enrolled in an accredited two-year college, four-year college or a university; or a high school senior accepted for such enrollment.
- pursuing, or planning to pursue, a course of study leading toward a career in physics teaching in the high schools.
- showing promise of success in their studies, and
- a citizen of the United States of America.

Applications will be accepted at any time and will be considered for recommendation to the Executive Board at each AAPT Winter Meeting. All applications in which all materials, including letters of recommendation, are received by December 1 will be considered for recommendation at the winter meeting of the AAPT Executive Board.Applications can be submitted online at https://www.aapt.org/programs/grants/blotze\_application.cfm. You should enter a unique ID at the bottom of the online application page so that you can edit your application if you need to return to it. Emails will automatically be sent to your references requesting letters of support for your online application.

Cheerleading Scholarship: To recognize and reward outstanding cheerleaders exemplifying sound character and academic standing, good sportsmanship, and school spirit by providing financial assistance in furthering his or her college/university education. - The applicant must not have previously spoken at the Dr. Robert H. Goddard Memorial Dinner.
- The applicant may apply for any of the scholarships offered by the National Space Club and Foundation (Robert H. Goddard Memorial Scholarship, Olin E Teague Scholarship, Keynote Scholarship) in the same year, but may only win one in the same year.

The winner will receive a full tuition scholarship for up to four years. Both high school students planning to attend college, as well as current undergraduate students may apply. To be eligible for the scholarship, students must remain in the STEM field for the entirety of her undergraduate career. All fields within science, technology, engineering, and math are eligible. All submissions will be judged by a board of sixty women who hold higher degrees and work professionally in science and engineering.
