NON-SCHOOL SPECIFIC SCHOLARSHIPS

The AAPT Executive Board offers the **AAPT Barbara Lotze Scholarship** for **future high school physics teachers**. Applicants must declare their intent to prepare for and engage in a career in physics teaching at the high school level. Successful applicants receive a stipend of up to \$2,000 and a complimentary AAPT Student Membership for one year. The scholarship may be granted to an individual for each of four years. Applications in which all materials, including letters of recommendation must be received by December 15, 2016 for consideration at the winter meeting of the AAPT Executive Board. Applicants must possess a GPA of 2.5 and demonstrate financial need. NAACP membership and participation is highly desirable. The **ICMA-RC Vantagepoint Public Employee Memorial Scholarship Fund** provides financial assistance to the surviving spouses and children of employees who have died in the line of duty. It is open to high school seniors, college undergraduate and graduate students. Applicants must plan to enroll or be enrolled full-time in an accredited college, university, or vocational-technical school. They must be the **survivors of police officers, firefighters, and other local and state government employees who have died in the line of duty**. The scholarship is awarded to students with academic merit as well as financial need. The scholarship can be used for tuition and fees. The scholarship is sponsored by the ICMA-RC Memorial Scholarship Fund, a non-profit organization founded in 2001 to honor the lives of the nation's police officers, firefighters, and other government employees who have died in service to their communities. The **Jack and Jill Foundation Scholarship** is a national scholarship that is open to African American high school seniors who are planning to attend full-time an accredited four-year college or university. Students must have a grade point average of 3.0 or above in order to apply. In addition to scholastic achievement, students must demonstrate leadership capabilities through extracurricular activities and volunteer community service. KFC Colonel's Scholars Program. This is a program of the Kentucky Fried Chicken Foundation, a charity funded by KFC to provide high school students scholarship resources to attend post-secondary schools within their states of residence. Students who meet the criteria may apply online at www.kfcscholars.org to become a KFC Colonel's Scholar. Applicants must have a 2.75 GPA and be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident. Students selected for this scholarship are eligible to receive up to \$20,000 to complete a bachelor's degree program. The online application will be **available beginning December 1st**. The **Life Lessons Scholarship Program.** This aim of this scholarship is to support students who have lost a parent or guardian. The loss of a parent or guardian is one of life's most difficult ordeals. Recognizing the character and perseverance that so many young people show in the face of such adversity, the LIFE Foundation sponsors the LIFE Lessons Scholarship Program for college-bound high school seniors. The Clary Medal is an award based on the individual's excellence in athletic participation, extra-curricular activities, and community service. **One male student athlete and one female student athlete** will be selected to receive the medal and a \$2,000 scholarship each to be awarded at the NCHSAA Annual Meeting in May. Nominees must have participated on two or more varsity school-sponsored NCHSAA sanctioned athletic teams during his/her high school career, have a 3.2+ GPA, and have demonstrated athletic excellence through awards, honors, and special recognitions. Optimist International Oratorical Contest. This contest is open to high school students under the age of 18 who are planning to enroll in college and have an interest in public speaking. Winners at the district level win college scholarships. Students may choose to enroll in either a two-year or four-year college or university and may attend part-time or full-time. They must be citizens of the U.S. or Canada. The current oratorical topic is **"What the World Gains from Optimism"** Students are required to give a 4-5 minute speech on this subject. The speech may be submitted to a local Optimist Club for entry. Winners compete at the club level, then proceed to zone competition, and finally compete at the district level. The scholarship covers all tuition expenses such as tuition, room and board, books and fees. The scholarship is renewable for up to 10 semesters, making it a full-ride scholarship for one deserving student. The scholarship recipient must be planning to attend a HBCU college in the Fall following graduation from high school. The scholarship will continue to cover all college expenses as long as the student maintains a GPA of 3.0 and is enrolled in at least 15 credit hours per semester. The prestigious scholarship is sponsored by the Tom Joyner Foundation, founded in 1998 by Tom Joyner and located in Irving, Texas.
