In-State School Scholarships

OUT-OF-STATE SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

Every year, **Boston University** welcomes about 25 outstanding students to the **Trustee Scholars Program**. Many of our current Scholars had perfect 4.0 grade point averages in high school, and most ranked in the top 1% of their class. However, students in the top 10% of their class are encouraged to apply for the scholarship. All Trustee Scholars receive a renewable scholarship covering full undergraduate tuition and mandatory fees for up to four years. Applicants must be nominated by their schools.
