Course Description:

The AP U.S. History course focuses on developing students' understanding of American history from approximately 1491 to the present. The course has students investigate the content of U.S. history for significant events, individuals, developments, and processes in nine historical periods, and develop and use the same thinking skills and methods (analyzing primary and secondary sources, making historical comparisons, chronological reasoning, and argumentation) employed by historians when they study the past. The course also provides seven themes (American and national identity; migration and settlement; politics and power; work, exchange, and technology; America in the world; geography and the environment; and culture and society) that students explore throughout the course in order to make connections among historical developments in different times and places.

Assignment Details:

Time Period One (1491-1607): Age of Exploration and Pre-Columbian Societies (20% of Assignment Grade)

Students will:

- 1. Complete chapter 1 of Howard Zinn's A People's History of the United States
- 2. Complete the online assessment of Zinn's Chapter 1 (found on Assignment website) You must log in to the assessment using your WCPSS student email address.
- 3. Complete the provided chart on Native American regions and European interaction (students may use text pages provided online for additional support)

Time Period Two (1607-1754) Colonization (20% of Assignment Grade)

Students will:

- 1. Read chapters 2 and 3 of Howard Zinn's A People's History of the United States
- 2. Complete organizers on conflicts described in the reading. Note people involved, causes of the conflicts, and result.
- 3. Complete the online assessment of Zinn's Chapters 2 and 3 (found on Assignment website) You must log in to the assessment using your WCPSS student email address.
- 4. Complete the chart provided on the different colonial regions (New England, Middle, and Southern) with information from your readings, and supplemental text provided.

Time Period Three (1754-1800) American Revolution and New Government (20% of Assignment Grade) Students will:

- 1. Read chapter 4 of Howard Zinn's A People's History of the United States
- 2. Complete the online assessment of Zinn's Chapter 4 (found on Assignment website) You must log in to the assessment using your WCPSS student email address.

- 3. Complete the readings on the Stamp Act
- 4. Complete the discussion questions provided on the Stamp Act primary sources

Book Review/Book Talk (40% of Assignment Grade)

- 1. Students must select THREE Historical Readings, ONE from each Time Period. List of Book options will be posted on assignment website.
- 2. Students must complete a Book Review on each book.
- 3. Students have the option of either creating a Video Book Review (Book Talk) or a typed Book Review
- 4. Expectations, Specifications, and the assignment Rubric will be posted on the summer assignment website.
- 5. Students choosing to do videos may upload videos on Youtube and provide their assigned teacher with the links or Students may provide them on a flashdrive to their assigned teacher.
- 6. Students choosing to complete typed Book Reviews should turn those in as part of their Summer Assignment Portfolio.
