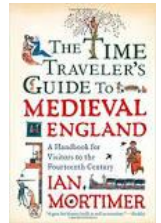


Welcome to AP European History!

Part of this assignment will be to read the books "The Time Traveler's Guide to Medieval England," by Ian Mortimer. You can check out a copy of this book from me before you leave for the summer or purchase it yourself (I recommend this so that you can make notes in the book while you read.
