



## PURPOSE

- The purpose of Summer School is for students to recover credits in which they were not successful during the regular school year.

## SUMMER SCHOOL STUDENT GUIDELINES

- **Students eligible for Summer School should have a final grade of 40-59 in Math, English, Science or Social Studies.** Students with a final grade of below 40 will either need to be enrolled in Credit Recovery next school year -OR- retake the class.
- There are three student pathways for Summer School students. They are as follows:
  - **Onsite Students- RECOMMENDED**
    - These students will take the credit recovery course onsite at the school (modules can be worked on at home for homework to complete the assigned work faster).
    - Students will take pre and post assessments for each objective.
    - Students will be able to place out of an objective based on their pre assessment performance.
    - Students will earn a P for the course after completing the Summer School course objectives.
  - **Blended - Onsite/Offsite Student**
    - These students will take the credit recovery course onsite and offsite.
    - The course modules can be completed at home, but the student will have to come onsite to take the post assessments for each objective.
    - Students will take pre and post assessments for each objective onsite.
    - Students will be able to place out of an objective based on their pre assessment performance.
    - Students will earn a P for the course after completing the Summer School course objectives.
  - **Offsite Students (Requires Prior School Approval- see hardship application on next page)**
    - These students will take the credit recovery course offsite based on hardship applications approved by the school.
    - The course pre and post assessment function will be turned off for these students.
    - The teacher assigned to these students must communicate with these students during the week and track progress and time of completion of modules. If adequate progress is not made every two days, students will not be allowed to continue in Summer School.
    - The student will have to come onsite for the course summative assessment. A student must receive a 60% or higher on the summative assessment to receive a P for the course.

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**Offsite Summer School Policies/Expectations**

- Participation in offsite Summer School is a privilege.
- Students are expected to log in and complete work in their Summer School courses daily.
- Students attending Summer School to recover a credit are expected to make consistent and satisfactory progress: every two days, students should have completed at least 20% of the modules assigned (otherwise their participation may be revoked).
- Students must go onsite to take a comprehensive test to achieve credit for the course (this is mandatory).
- Students are required to adhere to the Wake County School Board Policies & PCHS policies and expectations while enrolled in Summer School.
- Failure to make adequate progress and/or follow Wake County Schools Board Policies will result in removal from the offsite Summer School option.
- Transportation will not be available for students to come onsite for the comprehensive test.
