READ, READ!

Read to your children, read with your children, and encourage your children to read on their own. Check in with your child to confirm they are comprehending Fiction and Nonfiction texts.

Nonfiction

Identify the main idea and key details

1) Place value

Please take the time to practice place value with your child so they have a **strong** understanding of the ones and tens place.

2) Adding and subtracting <u>fluently</u> within 20.

Learners should be able to mentally add and subtract numbers within 20 by the end of second grade!

3) 1 step word problems. Students should practice finding the equation in one step word problems and verbally explain steps to solve.

Evidence: Proof or clues to support your thinking.

Genre: The way that books, movies, and music are organized.

Support: To use examples in order to strengthen your answer.

Text: a book or other printed or other written work.

Difference: What you find when you subtract one number from another number.

Digit: A single whole number.

Estimate: to guess an amount that is close to the correct answer.

Equation: Two groups of numbers that have the same value.

Equal: To have the same value.
