


Graduation Requirements

- You MUST have 26 credits to graduate.
- 2 must be any combination of courses in Foreign Language, the Arts, or CTE
- All students must have 4 math credits to graduate.
- 2 foreign language credits are required for students interested in attending one of the 16 public universities in NC.

The Laude Honors System



1st semester grades will be used to project final GPA's to determine Laude Honors.

- Summa Cum Laude: weighted GPA 4.25 or higher
- Magna Cum Laude: weighted GPA 4.0 4.249
- Cum Laude: weighted GPA 3.75 3.99

***If you would like to have your GPA recalculated in June after exams, that can be done as well (see your counselor).

NC Scholars



- Students who receive the NC Scholars Honor must have a 3.5 unweighted GPA.
- In addition, they must fulfill certain course requirements that were listed on your credit review sheet you received during your spring Junior Meeting/Registration last year.
- Students potentially eligible for NC Scholars should see their counselors if they have questions.

Plans After Graduation

College/University

- Students planning on attending a 2 or 4-year university should start applying now! Most students apply to anywhere from 3 to 5 schools. One should be a pretty definite and one may be a longer shot dream school. Make sure to check admission requirements and application deadlines for each college <u>BEFORE</u> you apply.
- You can also use the college SAT/GPA information on the handout. Always check the college website for admission requirements.
- All applications should be completed online through the individual college website, the Common App, or on CFNC.

<u>Military</u>

• Students planning on going into the military should be in contact with a recruiter from their branch of choice and take the ASVAB (offered again in the spring, date is TBD)

Work Force

Students joining the job force should start their search early, discuss options with Mrs. Daughenbaugh, Career Development Coordinator (Room 1101), and use teachers and faculty for recommendation letters.



Applying to 2 and 4-Year Colleges & Universities



CFNC: The College Foundation of NC

- On CFNC (www.cfnc.org) you can learn how to Plan, Apply and Pay for college.
- Save time and energy using <u>www.cfnc.org</u> when you use the site for your applications. All common information will be saved and applied to each application.
- CFNC hosts College Application Week from October 18th -22nd during which time many of the private schools (and a few public schools) waive the application fee. More details on the school website and cfnc.org.
- For students who plan to work and want to explore career options, CFNC has a career tab to help you identify good career choices for your personality.
- Complete **RDS** using your CFNC account (see next slide).

Residency Determination Service (RDS)

- Must be completed <u>BEFORE</u> doing your college admission applications & requires parent information
- Students GO TO: RDS at <u>www.ncresidency.org</u>
- Login to RDS using your CFNC User Name and Password (RESET, if you can't remember)
- RDS and applying for admission via CFNC is seamless.
 You are assigned a number (RCN #) and it will be prefilled on your applications
- Students not using CFNC have a simple link to RDS on the college admission application

Residency Determination Service (RDS)

- What if I DO NOT AGREE with my RDS determination?
 - Log in to RDS to review status, residency classification, and check for required documents
 - Correct or enter additional information in a RECONSIDERATION
 - Have 10 days to request an APPEAL (provide special information to prove NC residency)
 - Call RDS toll-free: 844-319-3640
- What if I am a DACA student, I'm dependent, but my parents are not residents, and/or I'm financially independent or in transition?
 - You can answer NO to being a resident, fill out the RDS and still be assigned a RCN #. Or, appeal your decision and a RDS specialist will work one-on-one with students for determination. Also see your counselor for help if needed.

Colleges & Universities Participate in Free College Application Week October 18th – 22nd



- Now is the best time to plan which NC college(s) you'd like to apply to so you can become familiar with their deadlines, requirements, and if they waive their applications fees during CFNC week.
- Many NC colleges outright waive their application fee during this week. Check out the NC College Application Fees for CAM 2021 document for application fee policies of NC colleges and universities during the week.
- During this week, all NC colleges and universities accept the College Board or ACT fee waiver in lieu of an application fee, for students who qualify (see your high school counselor for more information).

ACT/SAT

✓ Many schools this year are **test-optional** meaning ACT/SAT scores are **NOT** required. (make sure to check the each school's individual policy)

if you are still planning to take the ACT/SAT.....

- ✓ Check the testing websites for information regarding test dates and deadlines, registration, test practice, and how to request scores be sent to the universities
- ✓ Send test scores to colleges through the websites
 - ✓ SAT www.collegeboard.org
 - ✓ ACT www.actstudent.org

Requesting Official Transcripts

- Request a FREE electronic transcript to be sent to any NC public or private institution through www.CFNC.org. You will need a PowerSchool ID and a CFNC account.
 - > Go to www.cfnc.org Apply To College Application Hub
- Transcripts can also be requested through WCPSS
 - Go to www.wcpss.net/transcripts
 - > The first 3 are free. There is a \$5.00 charge for each additional request.
- Please allow for a 48-hour turn around for all requests
- Transcripts for scholarships Please see Ms. Stone
- NOTE: Counselors DO NOT send transcripts

Financial Aid



- Whether attending a 2 or 4 year university, you are likely eligible for financial aid.
- In order to be eligible for financial aid you MUST complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) on line at fafsa.ed.gov. It is recommended that you fill out the FAFSA along with your RDS as both require similar information.
- You can begin submitting applications on October 1st, 2021.
- Our financial aid counselor is **Ms. Sandra Winters**. She can answer your questions and walk you through the financial aid process including filling out the FAFSA. Make appointments through the Student Services office or email. Ms. Winters is here on Tuesdays. swinters@wcpss.net

Scholarships

- Scholarships and scholarship search engines are on the school website. www.wcpss.net/garnerhs
 Click Class of 2022
- CFNC also has scholarship information.
- Individual schools also have Scholarships. You must apply and pay attention to *deadlines*!
- Turn in all copies of scholarship notifications *on official letterhead* to Ms. Davidson as soon as you get them!

Student Resumes

- Students who plan to work after graduation or who plan to request teacher and/or counselor recommendations need to have some sort of resume.
- This resume or activities list should be presented to the teacher or counselor with the recommendation request.
- 2-3 weeks notice for recommendations is highly recommended to ensure you get the best recommendation possible.
- If you are using the Common Application, when you invite your counselor to fill out your school report, <u>immediately email your counselor to notify them and fill out the recommendation form (next slide)</u>. It's necessary to be able to fill out your ratings.





Does this sound familiar? We ALL do it!

Effective time management & setting goals are skills that need to be learned and practiced.



We have to commit to put new behaviors and skills into action.

Stress \rightarrow can interfere with effective time management and goal setting. Remember this chart from last year?

Ways to prevent or cope with stress

Make	Make healthy choices – eat, sleep, exercise. • Teens need 9-9 1/2 hours of sleep per night. Lack of sleep may lead to difficulty concentrating, poor school/work performance, anxiety/depression.
Get	Get support and/or try to understand your feelings. • Find a trusted adult. Your SCHOOL COUNSELOR is a great support!
Keep	Keep a sense of humor and perspective. • Laughter is the best medicine.
Resolve	Resolve or eliminate source of stress. • Toxic relationships? Too many work hours? Taken on too many commitments?
Identify	Identify how to prevent stress in the future. • How do I do that? Start with the 4 suggestions above!

Motivation \rightarrow is what drives us to succeed. How to improve motivation?

- ★ Start with small, achievable goals
- ★ Focus on strengths
- ★ Get organized backpack, folders, room, work space, etc.
- ★ Focus on what you have control over
- ★ Surround yourself with positive people

- ★ Make a weekly schedule -- and stick to it
- ★ Make to-do lists daily -- prioritize
- \star Focus on one assignment at a time (use timers!)
- ★ Control time wasters (use timers!)
- ★ Reward yourself
