Good afternoon, this is Steve Mares, principal of Athens Drive Magnet High School, with announcements for the upcoming week. A copy of these announcements will be posted on our school website (<u>https://www.wcpss.net/athensdrivehs</u>), emailed and texted to our school families, and linked to the PTSA Athens Alert newsletter (<u>https://athensdriveptsa.com</u>).

FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL: Just a reminder that our First Day of School is on Monday, August 26th! Please know that we will start the first day of school in Drive Time (Homeroom), beginning at 7:25 a.m. I am looking forward to a great year of teaching and learning!

START TIME FOR SCHOOL: We will have the same start and end time for school again for the 2019 – 2020 school year. School will start at 7:25 a.m. every morning and end at 2:18 p.m. Please know that First Period begins promptly at 7:25 a.m. and students are expected to be in class, ready to learn at 7:25 a.m. each day. For the first 10 days of school, students will have a Drive Time Class (Homeroom) so that we can share important information and begin the year on a positive note. After those first 10 days, students will only attend their Drive Time Class once a week on Tuesday. Please know that our Daily Bell Schedule is posted to our webpage each day so that all students and school families know what our Bell Schedule for the day will be. We do have several different Bell Schedules that we use throughout the year due to special events like PSAT, ACT, Pep Rallies, etc. Please visit our website to see the general <u>Bell Schedule</u> for the school year and to check the banner of our website to see the Bell Schedule we are using each day.

STUDENT SCHEDULES: I am sure that everybody has now either seen or picked up a copy of their 2019 - 2020 schedule that was posted to PowerSchool. Please understand that while the vast majority of students' schedules have not changed, some students' schedules may see a change as we continue to enroll a large number of students. These are not major changes, but we do work to try to balance class size and try to meet the needs of our students and what they registered for. Students will receive their official schedule in their Drive Time Class on Monday, August 26^{th} —and that is the schedule they must follow. If your student did submit a Schedule Change Request form, please know that we are working our way through those requests, and we will make the changes we can and need to make to support our students. The schedule that students receive in their Drive Time class is their final schedule. Please understand that any additional requests for schedule changes will be considered for the following reasons only:

- 1. Enrolled in a course you have already completed and received credit.
- 2. Enrolled in a course for which you have not met the prerequisite.
- 3. Do not have a full schedule of 4 classes.
- 4. Want to move up/drop down a level in a core class (Must have signed Release form if dropping Honors/AP course).
- 5. Course needed for promotion and/or graduation.

If a student meets one of the above criteria, then a Request for Schedule Change form can be picked up from the Student Services office and completed. Please remember that no class changes are guaranteed even if a teacher has agreed to a change, there will be no changes made for teacher preference, and there will be no changes made for lunch preference. In addition, there will be no changes to Electives unless a student is enrolled in a course they have already passed or have not met the prerequisite for the course. The completed Schedule Change Request form must be returned to Student Services no later than 2:30 p.m. on Tuesday, September 3rd.

PEER AMBASSADORS: Please know that we will have Peer Ambassadors available in Student Services on Monday to provide tours to new students that were unable to attend Freshman Camp or tour this week. If your student is interested in getting a tour, please have them come to Student Services by 7:00 a.m. on Monday and an Ambassador will be assigned to your student.

NEW BELL SCHEDULE AND ADVANTAGE TIME: We are adjusting our daily Bell Schedule for this school year. Our new <u>Bell Schedule</u> can be found on our website. Instead of having our Advantage Time Monday through Thursday as we did last year, we are going to have our Advantage Time for each period on one day, Wednesday. Advantage Time is a 24-minute portion of a class, during the school day, that allows our teachers to provide opportunities for students to make-up missed assignments, take assessments they may have missed, provide remediation, extension, small-group support, and re-teaching on curriculum that have been difficult for students. Students who have below a 75% average for the class must stay in the class and engage in

the Advantage Time period. If a student has a 75% or higher in that class, students will have the opportunity to attend a Club meeting during that Advantage Time. If a student has a 75% or higher average in the class but does not participate in a Club during Advantage Time, the student will remain in the class for that period. We are hoping that this provides students the opportunity to achieve at their highest potential in every class and have access to their teachers during the day to assist with make-up work, extra support, etc., and to allow students time during the day to participate in clubs in order to better connect and engage in their high school experience. There may still be times when clubs will meet outside of the Club time during Advantage Time, but we hope this helps more students access club opportunities and find/follow their passions. Thank you for your understanding of our efforts to continue to find ways to support teaching and learning, help students connect to Athens Drive and each other, and help each of our students reach his/her ultimate potential!

SAT PREP COURSE: Our first SAT Prep Course will soon be starting. The course will begin on September 3rd so that the students taking the course will be prepared for the SAT that is being administered on Saturday, October 5th. This course is for Juniors and Seniors and the cost is \$250.00. If your student is interested in enrolling in this course, he/she will need to see Mr. Remaley in Room 2618.

SENIORS TEXT MESSAGE: Senior parents, Mr. Remaley is our Senior Advisor and he does an outstanding job communicating with our Seniors and Senior families. Please sign up for Mr. Remaley's Senior Text Messages to get all the most up-to-date Senior Class event information. To enroll in his text message, please text the message: @theremaley to the number 81010. This is an invaluable resource for our Seniors and their families.

CARPOOL INFORMATION: We have added <u>carpool maps</u> to our website to assist families in understanding where to drop students off in the morning and where to pick students up in the afternoon.

BUS TRANSPORTATION: If your student will be riding the bus to school, students and families that have transportation eligible bus riders can find our new bus routes for the 2019 – 2020 school year posted online at http://www.wcpss.net/routes. Look for Athens Drive High School on this page and click the link to find our bus routes. Please find the intersection nearest your residence and that will be your bus stop. Please be familiar with your bus route and plan to get to your bus stop at least 10 minutes early. Wake County Public School System will also share your student's transportation route, stop, and estimated bus arrival time on-line in PowerSchool. Families can also check bus routes at school if they need too. Mr. Coats, our Assistant Principal who leads our Bus Transportation efforts, will be helping students during Lunch the first week of school to find bus information and provide Temporary Bus Passes for those eligible students who dependent on a yellow school bus to attend school while a transportation service request is being processed. There are many changes at the start of the new school year as new students begin riding the bus, new bus routes are created, and new drivers are trained. I would ask that you please be patient and understanding with transportation for the first few days of school. Thank you for your support.

HERE COMES THE BUS APP: For the 2019 - 2020 school year, the Here Comes the Bus app will be available to families today, Friday, August 23^{rd} . Existing app users will need to add students back, but should not need to reinstall the app. Wake County Public School System (WCPSS) will be sharing information about the Here Comes the Bus app with our families via a web article and message sent out to families from them.

BEING A GOOD NEIGHBOR: As we begin a new school year, I would like to remind all our students and families to be respectful of our Athens Drive neighbors. Please remind your students to park legally, drive in a safe manner, throw trash away properly in trash cans, and use appropriate language as they walk, drive, and move around our school campus. We want to be responsible and respectful neighbors, and I ask that we all represent The Drive in only the highest manner. Thanks for helping to carry on over 40-year tradition of excellence both inside and outside of the classroom!

DRESS CODE: Parents, as students prepare their outfits for Day 1 and beyond, I would like to again enlist your support in helping us maintain appropriate dress at school. Wake County Public School System (WCPSS) has adopted a new <u>Dress Code Policy</u>, Please be sure that students do not wear strapless shirts and dresses, tanktops, short-shorts, clothing that reveals undergarments, and other clothing that violates the dress code. Hats,

hoodies, do-rags, and bandanas will also not be allowed to be worn on school grounds. I would ask that we work together to be sure our students dress appropriately and focus on learning. I thank you for your support!

VOLUNTEERING AT ATHENS DRIVE: Please remember that if you would like to volunteer at Athens Drive, or in any Wake County Public School System school, you must register or reactivate prior to helping with any tutoring, office support, PTSA, sports, band, or club activity this school year. You can register to Volunteer at a computer in the Library during school hours. Thank you for helping us maintain a safe school climate conducive to learning.

GRADUATION: I am fired up to announce that our Graduation date and time for our Class of 2020 has been finalized! Our Seniors will be Graduating on Wednesday, June 10th, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. at Reynolds Coliseum! Please note the change in venue for this year—the Class of 2020 will be Graduating at Reynolds Coliseum instead of the Raleigh Convention Center. Please be sure to save this date and time to celebrate the accomplishments of the Class of 2020! In addition, Seniors need to also be sure they attend the mandatory Graduation Rehearsal on Monday, June 8th, 2020 from 6:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. at Reynolds Coliseum.

PARKING PASS: Parking passes for Juniors and Seniors in good standing for the 2019 – 2020 school year are now available. Students interested in securing a Parking pass for the 2019 – 2020 school year should carefully read and follow the guidelines on the application. To complete the Parking Pass Application process, please complete the on-line parking registration. Then, please print & complete the two-page paper application. Please note Parent's signature must be notarized on the second page of the application. Please complete the On-Line Payment to pay for the Parking pass. You will then need to print your On-Line Receipt to include with your application. Please make a clear photocopy of your valid North Carolina Driver's License (permanent photo—a permit temporary license will not be accepted) and vehicle registration(s). Finally, please remember that students must have cleared all fees or fines they have, as a Parking Tag will not be issued if the student has any outstanding fees or fines owed. Parking tags may be picked up Monday through Friday, between 8:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. Please know that Parking passes and Off Campus Lunch passes are two separate applications.

OFF-CAMPUS LUNCH PASS: Off-Campus Lunch passes for Juniors and Seniors in good standing for the 2019 – 2020 school year are also now available. A Junior or Senior student cannot leave campus during lunch without having an authorized Off-Campus Lunch pass. Freshmen and Sophomores are NEVER allowed to leave campus during the school day, unless on an approved school trip. To complete this process, please print and complete the one-page paper application. Please note that the parent's signature must be notarized on the application. Please complete the On-Line Payment to pay for the Off-Campus Lunch pass. You will then need to print your On-Line Receipt to include with your application. Finally, please remember that students must have cleared all fees or fines they have, as an Off-Campus Lunch pass will not be issued if the student has any outstanding fees or fines owed. Passes may be picked up Monday through Friday, between 8:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. Please know that Parking passes and Off Campus Lunch passes are two separate applications.

FALL SEMESTER MEET THE TEACHER NIGHT: Please mark your calendar that our Fall Meet the Teacher Night will be held on Thursday, September 5th, beginning at 6:00 p.m. At 5:30 p.m., prior to our Meet the Teacher Night, we will be holding a Senior Parent Meeting and at 5:30 p.m., our PTSA will be providing information on how to support our school through volunteering and donating to our PTSA.
