THANK YOU FOR A GREAT START TO THE YEAR! I hope everybody has had an excellent start to the new school year! I am very proud of the outstanding start we have had, and I thank you for your support!

NO SCHOOL ON MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 2ND: Please remember that Monday, September 2nd is Labor Day and a school Holiday for both students and staff. There is no school on Monday, September 2nd.

CLASS MEETINGS: This week we began our Class meetings to discuss expectations for the year and to remind students of the importance of starting the year strong and finishing the year strong. With regards to our Senior Class meeting, our goal is for every Senior in the Class of 2020 to Graduate on June 10th! I look forward to a great year with the leadership of our Seniors! We will complete our Class meetings on Tuesday with the last half of the Freshman Class.

SENIOR CLASS REMIND SIGN-UP: Senior parents, Mr. Remaley is our Senior Advisor and he does an outstanding job communicating with our Seniors and Senior families. DRESS CODE: Please know that through our Class meetings and through individual conversations with students, we are trying to remind students about the Dress Code and maintaining appropriate dress at school. Wake County Public School System (WCPSS) has adopted a new <u>Dress Code Policy</u>, Please help us be sure that students do not wear strapless shirts and dresses, tank-tops, short-shorts, clothing that reveals undergarments, and other clothing that violates the dress code. Hats, hoodies, do-rags, and bandanas will also not be allowed to be worn on school grounds. I would ask that we work together to be sure our students dress appropriately and focus on learning. I thank you for your support!

STUDENTS MUST HAVE A VALID PARKING PASS TO PARK ON CAMPUS: I would like to ask all students and parents to help us ensure that only those students who have a valid Parking Pass park on campus. We have several students already who are parking on campus who do not have a valid Parking Pass. Please understand that any student who parks on campus must have a Parking Pass and park only in their assigned space. It is important for us to know who is parking in each space and have parent permission for students to drive and park on campus. Please also understand that Athens does not retain any of the money collected for the Parking Passes—the money collected for Parking Passes goes directly to Wake County Public School System and pays for our Security Officer on Campus who patrols the outside of the school. If a Junior or Senior want to purchase a Parking Pass, they can still purchase one. Students interested in securing a Parking pass for the 2019 - 2020 school year should carefully read and follow the guidelines on the application. To complete the Parking Pass Application process, please complete the on-line parking registration. Then, please print & complete the two-page paper application. Please note Parent's signature must be notarized on the second page of the application. Please complete the On-Line Payment to pay for the Parking pass. You will then need to print your On-Line Receipt to include with your application. Please make a clear photocopy of your valid North Carolina Driver's License (permanent photo—a permit temporary license will not be accepted) and vehicle registration(s). Finally, please remember that students must have cleared all fees or fines they have, as a Parking Tag will not be issued if the student has any outstanding fees or fines owed.

STUDENTS LEAVING CAMPUS FOR LUNCH: As we discussed in our Class Meetings, Juniors and Seniors who have an approved Off-Campus Lunch Pass are the only students who may leave campus for lunch. A Junior or Senior student cannot leave campus during lunch without having an authorized Off-Campus Lunch Pass. Freshmen and Sophomores are NEVER allowed to leave campus during the school day, unless on an

approved school trip. If a Junior or Senior would like to purchase a Lunch Pass (the cost is \$5.00 for the year), please print and complete the one-page paper application. Please note that the parent's signature must be notarized on the application. Please complete the On-Line Payment to pay for the Off-Campus Lunch pass. You will then need to print your On-Line Receipt to include with your application. Finally, please remember that students must have cleared all fees or fines they have, as an Off-Campus Lunch pass will not be issued if the student has any outstanding fees or fines owed.

FALL SEMESTER MEET THE TEACHER NIGHT: Our Fall Semester Meet the Teacher Night will be held on Thursday, September 5th, beginning at 6:00 p.m. At 5:30 p.m., prior to our Meet the Teacher Night, we will be holding a Senior Parent Meeting and at 5:30 p.m. in the Auditorium, and our PTSA will be providing information on how to support our school through volunteering and donating to our PTSA.
