COURSE REGISTRATION FOR THE 2020 – **2021 SCHOOL YEAR IS BEGINNING:** Students received course information in Drive Time today. All registration information, course listing, timelines, High School Planning Guide, and course descriptions are located on this <u>link</u> on the Athens Drive website. We encourage parents and students to review the material on guide to ensure that students are registering for courses that meet the graduation requirements. Students must claim their NC EDCloud Student Account in order to register for courses. Please visit this <u>link</u> on the Athens Drive website or visit the Student Services office to obtain instructions on how students can claim their account. Counselors will meet with all students to assist with the registration process. Registration appointments will be scheduled for all students and students are encouraged to attend their registration meeting. A schedule of appointments will be available outside of the Student Services office. Here is the Registration Timeline:

- **February 10th through March 15th:** Registration portal opens for Ninth and Eleventh Grade students. Counselors will meet individually with 11th Grade students for registration and academic planning. A schedule of appointments will be posted outside of the Student Services office. Registration portal will close for 11th graders on March 15th.
- **February 13th through April 27th:** Counselors will meet individually with Ninth Grade students for registration and academic planning. A schedule of appointments will be posted outside of the Student Services office. Registration portal will close for Ninth Grade students on April 27th.
- March 10th through April 27th: Registration Portal opens for Tenth Grade students. Counselors will meet individually with Tenth Grade students for registration and academic planning. A schedule will be posted outside of the Student Services office of appointments. Registration portal will close for Tenth Grade students on April 27th.

Students should complete the High School Registration Work Plan and bring it to their meeting with the Counselors. Helpful Hints for registration:

1. Students should register for the 8 primary courses and 3 alternate courses that they wish to take and make sure that there are 3 alternates. ALTERNATE COURSES SHOULD BE COURSES STUDENTS

ARE WILLING TO TAKE. STUDENT SERVICES WILL NOT CHANGE A COURSE IF THE STUDENT HAS REGISTERED FOR IT AS A PRIMARY OR AN ALTERNATE SELECTION.

- 2. Students should consult with their teacher if they feel that the recommendation for a class is not correct or if they need a recommendation for a class. Students and teachers should dialogue about appropriate courses.
- 3. Students in the STEM Academy should register for the STEM section for English I-V, Math (II & III only), Social Studies, & Science (Biology & Chemistry Only). These courses will be denoted with a W at the end of the course code. This information will be shared in the STEM meetings that will be scheduled.
- 4. Students in the HSCA Academy (beginning with the Class of 2022) will be cohorted in their English and Social Study courses. These students should register for 10225X0C-English II (H) and 43045X0C-American History (H).

Please know that we build our Master Schedule based on what courses our students register for. We cannot change schedules later when a student changes his/her mind about the courses he/she has registered for. Thank you for helping us ensure that students select the courses they need and the courses they want during this registration period.

COMING HOME WEEK NEXT WEEK! Coming Home Week (Homecoming in the Winter!) starts on Monday, February 10th and that means time to show some school spirit! The request form is available at the Front Desk of the Student Services Office. Counselors will only send Mid-Year School Reports for students that complete the Request form.

STATE EMPLOYEES CREDIT UNION PEOPLE HELPING PEOPLE SCHOLARSHIP: Parents of Seniors, the State Employee's Credit Union's \$10,000.00 People Helping People Scholarship application is now available! To be eligible for the Scholarship the student or their parent should be a member, or eligible to be a member, of the State Employee's Credit Union. The student also needs to be attending one of the 16 UNC system Universities, have an unweighted Grade Point Average of a 2.5 or higher, and demonstrate leadership, excellence of character, integrity, and community involvement. The student also must file a Federal Application for Student Aid (FAFSA) as part of the application. Students will need to submit the completed application, and as part of the application, students should submit one recommendation letter from someone (no family members, please) who can speak to their community involvement. The recommendation is due at the same time as the application. The deadline to submit the applications (available on the Athens Drive Magnet High School Student Services Website under the Scholarship tab) must be typed and printed for submission. This is a great scholarship that at least one of our Seniors will be awarded, so please be sure your student is considering this opportunity!

PTSA SCHOLARSHIPS: Parents of Seniors, if your Senior is interested in applying for one of the PTSA's \$500.00 PTSA Scholarships they provide to Graduating Seniors, your Senior must be a member of the PTSA by the end of February. Seniors (and any families that have not joined yet!) can sign-up to be a PTSA member at this <u>link</u>. Please remember that the PTSA will be at the Senior Parent Meeting to help Seniors join the PTSA and be eligible for these Scholarships.

ACT PREPARATION: Please know that all Juniors will be taking the ACT on Tuesday, February 25th. The State of North Carolina pays for the administration of the ACT to all Juniors.
