Students need to be sure that they utilize their Wake County Public School System (WCPSS) email to register for their AP Exam(s). AP Exams will be administered May 6th through 17th. Students will receive an AP Bulletin with additional information about AP testing at the AP Registration Exam meetings on Monday, January 28th.
