Good afternoon, this is Steve Mares, principal of Athens Drive Magnet High School, with a special message for Friday, July 17th. NEW OR UPDATED ANNOUNCEMENTS:

NEWS ON THE POSSIBILITY OF WCPSS MOVING TO START THE YEAR IN PLAN C (FULLY REMOTE LEARNING): By now I am sure that most, if not all, of you have heard news that the Wake County Public School System (WCPSS) is considering moving to opening the school year in Plan C (fully remote learning) instead of the Plan B (Virtual Academy and Blended Learning) that has been approved by the Board of Education. Please know that WCPSS is aware of community and staff concerns and continues to monitor the best and safest reopening plan for our students, staff, and school families. Please understand that one of the reasons that Plan B was approved was that it is a flexible plan that can be changed if circumstances changed. So, please know that WCPSS continues to review options and information to make an informed decision about what plan we will be implementing for the reopening of school for the 2020 – 2021 school year. Until the Board approves any change to our reopening plan, we will continue to plan for the Plan B (Virtual Academy and Blended Learning) opening as has been approved, knowing that this could potentially change. Thank you, as always, for your continued patience, understanding, and flexibility as we work to open school at The Drive on August 17th.

IF WE DO OPEN WITH PLAN C (FULLY REMOTE LEARNING), DO I STILL NEED TO APPLY TO THE VIRTUAL ACADEMY IF I WANT A FULLY REMOTE LEARNING EXPERIENCE FOR MY

STUDENT? I have received this question several times in the last few days and I want to take time to address it. Yes, even if we open in Plan C (fully remote learning), if you want to ensure that your student only has a remote learning experience, then you need to register for our Virtual Academy. I say this because if we do open in Plan C and all students are served through remote learning, we could easily move back to a Plan B (Virtual Academy and Blended Learning) model, and any student who is NOT enrolled in our Virtual Academy will be moved to our Blended Learning environment and will then switch to our plan for a combination of in-person and remote learning instruction. If we did open in Plan C (fully remote learning) and did move back to a Plan B, then any student who is enrolled in our Virtual Academy will stay in our Virtual Academy and receive all of their instruction remotely. So, if you want to have a 100% remote learning environment for your student, you need to enroll your student in the Virtual Academy (you can do that at this link) and you will be set, at least for the Semester, but for the entire year of receiving remote instruction.

DESCRIPTION OF THE TWO OPTIONS FOR REOPENING OF SCHOOL—VIRTUAL ACADEMY OR BLENDED LEARNING: I know there are still many questions regarding the difference between what our Virtual Academy program will look like versus our Blended Learning program. And, I know that many of you are still debating exactly which platform for learning will work best for your student and family. I understand your concern and want to provide my thoughts on what both learning platforms will look like. Please understand that we continue to work on our Master Schedule and what the Daily Schedule will look like for students who are attending either option. While we haven't finalized our plans, I did want to help answer many questions that I have been receiving.

VIRTUAL ACADEMY:

- Students will be Athens Drive students and will officially be attending Athens Drive.
- Students will be able to participate in co-curricular, athletics, and clubs for Athens Drive while participating in the Virtual Academy.

- Students will still be able to participate in our STEM Academy and our Health Science Career Academy.
- Students are making a commitment of remaining in our Virtual Academy for at least the first Semester, but the recommendation is that the student will remain in the Virtual Academy for the entire year.
- It will be different (e.g., more "live" instruction, grades, rigor, etc.) than the Remote Learning that students experienced in the Spring Semester.
- Our plan is to provide "live" instruction each day, for each class, a student takes.
- Instruction will be provided Monday through Friday.
- We expect learning to be engaging, rigorous, and aligned to the Standards for each course.
- Assessments (e.g., tests, quizzes, research papers, projects, etc.) will be provided to students and grades will be earned.
- Course Grades, course Credits, and course Grade Point Averages will all be calculated the same for both Virtual Academy and Blended Learning.
- There will be a set schedule for classes. Attendance in "live" instruction will be expected, course work outside of the "live" instruction will be required to be completed, and Attendance will be taken.
- Courses will be taught by Athens Drive Teachers. (There may be a time that for a specific course offering we may group our students with students from another high school to be able offer the course to our students. However, I do not foresee this happening often, if at all.)
- Virtual Academy instruction will be a combination of "live" instruction, video instruction, and coursework.
- For those rising Seniors who are eligible, and are interested in Graduating Early (Mid-Year, January 2021), this is still an option.
- It is our plan that students will have access to all Honors and AP course offerings. However, we are still evaluating how we can teach certain classes that need specific tools (e.g., Carpentry, etc.) or programs (e.g., Drafting, Programming, etc.) that students may not have access to on their computers or in their homes.
- We are still working on a plan for those courses only taught by one teacher (e.g., Band, Chorus, Theatre, some CTE Course offerings, etc.) to have them available to students in both the Virtual Academy and Blended Learning platforms.
- If you are interested in registering for the Virtual Academy, please visit this <u>link</u> and register by 5:00 p.m. on July 20th.

BLENDED LEARNING:

- Students will be Athens Drive students.
- If you do not register for the Virtual Academy, you will be in our Blended Learning program. This is the "default" for all students.
- Students will come to school for in-person learning for a week, and then receive remote learning for the two weeks they are not in school.
- Our plan is to provide "live" instruction each day, for each class. During the in-person learning week, students will receive instruction on campus, in a classroom, and with their teacher. While the student is engaged in remote learning off campus, our plan is to continue "live" instruction for a portion of day. In addition, while in students are engaged in remote learning, students will be expected to complete coursework as well for the course.
- Instruction will be provided Monday through Friday.

- We expect learning to be engaging, rigorous, and aligned to the Standards for each course.
- Assessments (e.g., tests, quizzes, research papers, projects, etc.) will be provided to students and grades will be earned.
- Course Grades, course Credits, and course Grade Point Averages will all be calculated the same for both Virtual Academy and Blended Learning.
- There will be a set schedule for classes. Attendance in "live" instruction will be expected, course work outside of the "live" instruction will be required to be completed, and Attendance will be taken—even when in remote learning.
- Courses will be taught by Athens Drive Teachers.
- We are planning for students to have access each day to their Teacher for "live" instruction and we are working on a plan to provide additional time to our students in remote learning to access other Teachers in a "live" format to get instructional support.
- Students who are in their remote learning from home will be expected to follow a schedule and attend "live" sessions with their teacher.
- For safety reasons, we are planning for the following while students are on campus:
 - O Students will only be able to enter at specific entrances each morning with health screening at each entrance (e.g., temperature check, health screening questions, etc.).
 - O Students will be required to socially distance throughout the entire day. This is going to be a MAJOR change for students, as we know they will want to gather in groups, talk, hangout, etc. This just cannot happen. Please be sure that you speak to your student to assist them in understanding that returning to school this year will be quite different than returning to school in previous years.
 - o Students will eat Lunch in the Cafeteria or Courtyard, but there will be specific seats where students can sit on to ensure social distancing while eating.
 - o Breakfast and Lunch will be available for students while they are in-person, and while they are remote learning. We are working to provide a plan for a "drive-through" lunch pick-up for students who are not in school but need a meal.

I hope this information helps. However, as with almost everything now, these parameters may change depending on guidance from WCPSS, North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services, North Carolina Department of Public Instruction, and the Governor. Please know that since we haven't completed the Master Schedule and Daily Schedule for students and staff, it is hard to provide detailed information. We are also still waiting on detailed information/directives regarding instruction in both platforms from Wake County Public School System (WCPSS) to help us be able to finalize our plans. Please know that I will communicate with you more detailed plans as they are created. However, please know that our focus remains on providing a plan for safe teaching and learning for all students to grow and meet their ultimate potential!

DIFFERENT SCHEDULE FOR THE FIRST TWO WEEKS OF SCHOOL: In order to orient all of our students to our new schedule and provide planning time for our teachers to implement our new learning platforms, the first two weeks of school are going to look different than the rest of the weeks of school. On Monday, August 17th, the first "Cohort" in our Blended Learning platform will come to school and engage in in-person learning. On Tuesday, August 18th, no students will come to school. On Wednesday, August 19th, the second "Cohort" in our Blended Learning platform will come to school to engage in in-person learning. On Thursday, August 20th, no students will come to school. On Friday, August 19th, the third "Cohort" in our Blended Learning platform will come to school to engage in in-person learning. For the Second Week of School, the week of August 24th, we will follow the same schedule. Then, beginning with the Third Week of School, the week of August 31st, our

first "Cohort" will attend school for the entire week, while our second and third "Cohorts" will be remotely learning. The following week, the week of September 7th, our second "Cohort" will attend school for the entire week, while our first and third "Cohorts" will be remotely learning. Then, the week of September 14th, our third "Cohort" will attend school for the entire week, while our first and second "Cohorts" are remotely learning. Please understand that we do not anticipate getting Cohort information from WCPSS until the beginning of August and then we will have to prepare our Master Schedule based on those splits. WCPSS has assured us that students who have siblings at other schools and grade levels, and students who are residing in the same residence, will be placed on the same "Cohort." We are hoping to share "Cohort" information sometime at the beginning of August. For our Virtual Academy students, I anticipate **Please know that this information and schedule could change**, but at this time, that is the schedule we are planning for the first few weeks of school!

ACTION REQUIRED—CLASS OF 2021 VACCINATION REQUIREMENT INFORMATION: In accordance with North Carolina State Law, all students attending public schools entering the 12th Grade are required to receive a booster dose of Meningococcal vaccine. Most medical providers in Wake County are seeing appointments for health assessments and immunizations. At this time, the NC Immunization Program has stated they will not be extending the immunization requirements due to COVID-19. All required immunizations are <u>due by the first day of school</u>. If the parent/student has not provided immunization documentation after 30 calendar days from the start of school, the student MUST be excluded from school until documentation is provided. Thank you for your attention to this vital information.

CLASS OF 2021 MID-YEAR GRADUATION: If you have a rising Senior who is interested in Graduating Mid-Year (in January 2021 after the end of the First Semester), forms are available on the Student Services website for you to let us know. The Early Dismissal or Late Arrival form must be completed, scanned, and emailed to Ms. Telfair (stelfair@wcpss.net) by Wednesday, July 29th. STUDENT SCHEDULES FOR THE 2020 – 2021 SCHOOL YEAR: Please understand that we are continuing to finalize our Master Schedule for the 2020 – 2021 school year. With scheduling students for two options—Virtual Academy and Blended Learning—please understand that student schedules will change. As we get information about the choices that families make with regards to what option they choose, we will be changing

our Master Schedule which will impact student schedules. Thus, any schedule that a student currently sees, or will see, in PowerSchool is not final. Please understand that based on these new changes to the reopening of school, we will continue to work on our Master Schedule almost until the first day of school in August. I would ask students and families not to email Counselors or Administrators to discuss schedule change requests. Please understand that a schedule change request process will be established and shared with families in August if there is a need for a student to change his/her schedule.

JUNIORS AND SENIORS PARKING PASSES: Please understand that we are waiting on direction from the Wake County Public School System (WCPSS) regarding Parking Passes for the 2020 – 2021 school year. NORTH CAROLINA HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION (NCHSAA) CHANGES TO PHYSICAL POLICY: The NCHSAA has made quite a few changes for the coming year in response to the COVID-19 pandemic with regards to Physical forms. The updated policy regarding Physicals is outlined below in the table. We have been informed that all student athletes who had a valid Pre-Participation Examination (PPE) form dated anytime from March 1st, 2019 through May 1st, 2020 (used for the 2019 – 2020 school year) will be granted an emergency one-year extension through the end of the 2020 – 2021 school year. I hope this table helps you understand the new interpretations for participating in Athletics for the 2020 – 2021 Athletic Seasons:

Date of Current Physical	Requirement for 2020 – 2021 School Year
Prior to 03/01/2019	Need valid, up-to-date physical prior to participating.
On or after 03/01/2019 through 05/01/2020	Granted a temporary extension to participate through the end of the 2020 – 2021 academic school year.
On or after 05/02/20	Will participate based on the current policy of being "valid for 395 days."

If allowed this summer, a student athlete can participate in 2020 Summer Workouts with a physical dated on-orafter March 1st, 2019. Please also remember that a rising Ninth Grade student athlete is also subject to all the above. Please understand that all student athletes will still need to submit new registration paperwork prior to participating in any Workouts/Practices even if their Physical has not expired. Thank you for your understanding of the changing aspects of requirements for our student athletes.

DRIVERS EDUCATION UPDATE: Jordan Driving School is not accepting any new registration forms at this time. Once the class schedule has been determined for the school year, it along with the 2020 - 2021 Driver Education Registration form will be posted at www.jordandriving.com. Continue to monitor the Jordan Driving website for updates on the upcoming school year. Please see the Drivers Education Update from WCPSS for additional information.

PROCESS FOR OBTAINING A DRIVER'S ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE: To meet the needs of our students and families, we will be implementing the following process to allow students to receive a Driver's Eligibility Certificate (DEC) while our school building is closed due to COVID-19. Please remember that DECs are only valid for 30 days; therefore, students are only eligible to receive a DEC during this time if they have a confirmed appointment with the NCDMV within 30 days of the date of the request. You will start by sending an email request to Ms. Teresa Brown (tbrown3@wcpss.net), Dean of Students, and include the email from NCDMV confirming the date/time of the appointment. You will receive an email confirming the date/time you can come to the high school to receive the DEC. Once your appointment is confirmed with us, the following steps will be taken:

- Step 1: Scan or take a photo of the following:
 - o Student's birth certificate or passport
 - o Completed Driver's Education Certificate (if it has not been emailed ahead of time)
 - o Proof of address if the current address is different than the one listed on the Driver's Education Certificate or the address listed in PowerSchool. Address must be verified for the NC Real ID.
 - o Email this information to Ms. Brown, our designated contact at the school. This will limit the amount of paper that has to be exchanged by staff and students. If you are unable to scan or take a photo of the document, then you will need to bring all these documents with you to the appointment.
- Step 2: Bring the following documents to the appointment:

- Student's birth certificate or passport
- o Completed Driver's Education Certificate (if it has not been emailed ahead of time)
- o Proof of address if the current address is different than the one listed on the Driver's Education Certificate or the address listed in PowerSchool. Address must be verified for the NC Real ID.
- Step 3: Receiving the DEC:
 - Once you arrive for your appointment, a staff member will meet you at the front door of the school (entrance by the flagpole) to receive the DEC. It is important that we limit the amount of direct contact and maintain at least 6 feet of social distance. For this reason, please limit the number of family members (preferably just the student and a parent or guardian) who attend the appointment. Please arrive at the school promptly for your scheduled appointment to ensure that we can follow the social distancing guidelines that have been established.
 - o Staff will check the student's grades for adequate progress. The student must have passed 70% of the courses taken in the prior semester to receive a DEC.
 - Once grades have been verified and all other documents are in place, the DEC can be issued to the student.

Thank you for your understanding and support of this process to continue to provide DECs to our students.
