I talked to our students about how we are a family at Athens Drive, and I wanted to let them know that the teachers and staff at Athens Drive are honored to serve them and watch them grow. I know our world is experiencing challenging events and times, but please know that as a school family we work hard to come together and to take care of each other each day. Counselors will conduct Registration/Academic meetings with rising Sophomores in small groups from April 9<sup>th</sup> through April 26<sup>th</sup>. Please be talking with your student about the courses they are selecting for next year as we work to ensure that all our students are on a path to Graduate and reach their goals.

Please remember that we have finalized a day and time for our presentation on Vaping by the Poe Health Center for our students and families. We will hold this informational presentation on Tuesday, April 10<sup>th</sup>, from 6:30 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. in the Auditorium, in conjunction with our PTSA meeting. The Poe Health Center will be leading these presentations, and the evening will consist of both separate sessions for students and families, and a combined session for all of us. As I have stated before, we have seen a dramatic increase in vaping at Athens Drive, and we are concerned about the negative impacts on our students' health and the school disruption it is causing. I hope this is an informative presentation so that all of us can become more aware of the ramifications of vaping.

I want to remind you to put April 25<sup>th</sup> through April 27<sup>th</sup> on your calendar. The Athens Drive Theatre Department is deep into the rehearsal process for their much-anticipated spring musical, *In the Heights!
