Beginning October 9th, any student without an approved application for the 2017 – 2018 school year will be expected to pay full price for breakfast and lunch. To complete the application, families can apply online to qualify for free and reduced meals by going to https://www.wcpss.net/meals where there is information about the Free and Reduced Price meals program, frequently asked questions, and the new online application. Families may also receive a hard-

copy of the application in our Front Office, Students Services Office, and Cafeteria. Thank you for your support in taking care of this requirement.

WCPSS traditional calendar families, including Athens Drive families, will soon be able to use the bus tracking app *Here Comes the Bus*. *Here Comes the Bus* translates GPS data into an easy to use, customizable map that works on a computer, tablet, or smartphone. WCPSS will be communicating information to High School families on Monday, October 2nd. After that communication, families will be directed to sign up at https://herecomesthebus.com/getting-started/ and will be provided the district code. I hope this new app will be beneficial for the families of our students who have bus transportation.

Students can also earn a WTCC certificate in one of five program areas (Culinary Arts, Early Childhood Education, Emergency Medical Science, Hospitality Management, and IT-Tech Support) and are eligible to enroll in additional college level courses through WTCC to earn free, transferable college credits while still in High School.
