






Solar Panel Initiative - NCGreenPower

Student Contract

This contract is being e	entered into between <u>Student Name</u> who is set to graduate in
Graduation Year	and a representative of the STEM Energy and Sustainability Academy. It outlines
the expectations and r	equirements of students enrolled in the Academy. This agreement holds for as
long as the previously	mentioned student is enrolled in the Academy and ends upon graduation from the
Academy, withdraw fro	om the Academy, or removal from the Academy.

Conditions

The student must initial next to each condition showing that they understand what the condition agree to meet it during their time in the STEM Academy.

- A. STEM Portfolio: students are expected to create and maintain a STEM Portfolio update it to the guidelines set forth upon creation of this portfolio. Students are expected to update it to the ability and keep all information included professional.
- B. Class Projects: students are expected to put forth all required effort to complete projects assigned each year within the Academy. Students are expected to work with their a groups to the best of their ability and should bring any concerns to their project advisor or t Concernation.
- C. STEM Points: students are expected to complete Academy related activities to ear Points before moving on to the next grade within the Academy. Any issues in scheduling that student unable to complete this should be brought to the STEM Coordinator's attention with allowed for planning a solution.
- D. Student Grades: students are expected to maintain an acceptable GPA and put eff of their classes. This may range in exact GPA number between students and will be based mi feedback from teachers regarding student effort (le if a student is putting their maximum eff class then a lower grade may be acceptable).
- E. STEM Pathways: students are expected to choose one of the outlined STEM Pathwake an effort to complete all required classes within that pathway. While exceptions may be an individual basis regarding class options as a student moves throughout the Academy, it is that each student will make do their best to complete a pathway.

Failure to Meet Conditions

If a student does not meet the conditions outlined above they may be removed from the STEM Energy and Suttainability Academy. Failing to meet any one of the conditions can lead to removal. At least one warning will be provided before a student is removed. Student's will be treated as individuals in this process and each case will be considered separately (it some students may receive more warnings than others given the instantion).

Appeals Process A student who has been removed from the STEM Energy and Sustainability Academy may appeal to a

board of STEM members. This board will include the STEM Coordinator, an administrator involved in STEM acknewy planning, and a senior student in the STEM Academy (this student may either be obsert by the student to be removed or will be obsert at random). The board will also whe student to state their case for remaining in the Academy and will return a verdict (removal stands or allowed to stay) within 48 hours of the aposals. This section will be final.

 activities included


Identifying STEM Teachers
