Athens Drive will not offer Fundamental Math or Intro Math in semester one. Students in the STEM Program will choose the level of Math where they are in the sequence of Math. • Students who are interested in band, chorus and orchestra and also STEM may have to decide to skip a semester or two of band to complete the course requirements for STEM.

## What about Band, Orchestra, Drama and Chorus?

These courses are nice niches for students to create an identity with the school, but often students cannot elect these courses because they want to fulfill the Healthful Living Requirement. Freshmen have few open spots in their schedules after they sign up for core courses (Math, Science, Social Studies, English). Healthful Living is an important course, but many Freshmen who are interested in Performing Arts defer the Healthful Living credit to their sophomore year to pursue music or drama. After the Freshmen year, there are typically more open spots in a student's schedule.

Students at the middle school level should register for the beginning level of arts courses. If a student has demonstrated or can demonstrate mastery at a higher level, the teacher of the course will initiate a level change.

• BAND: There is no level I Band at Athens Drive HS. All Band students should register for 2 semesters of Band II.

• CHORUS: Students should register for Chorus I and II for the year. Chorus I will be the fall semester; chorus II will be spring
