

Path to College – 9th/10th Grade Planning

KEY POINTS

- *Visit colleges—make your visit when students are in session, if possible.
- * It is beneficial for students to research and visit more than one college—one "dream" school; one or two schools you hope that you can get in; and one school which you feel fairly confident that you will be admitted.
- * Be involved in activities in or out of school that involve quality experiences over an extended period of time. Colleges are looking for quality over quantity.
- * Get to know at least one teacher and your counselor just in case you need letters of recommendation to support your college application.
- * Create a resume so you are sure to include all your activities on your college applications.

Other post-secondary options

- * Students can attend community college to receive training in a specific field, earn an Associates in Applied Science (AAS) in areas such as X-Ray or ultrasound technician or dental hygiene, just to name a few. Students can also earn a university transfer degree (AS) with the plan of transferring to a four year school to earn a bachelors or advanced degree.
- * The military is another great post-secondary option. Representatives from the various branches visit HSHS throughout the year. Students can contact Mr. Herrick (sherrick@wcpss.net) for the schedule of military rep visits.
- * The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) is offered once in the fall and once in the spring. Mr. Herrick is the HSHS contact for the ASVAB.
