NEEDING FINAL TRANSCRIPTS

The college you are attending will want your final transcripts sent to them. If you are registered on CFNC they will automatically send them if you indicate which college you want them to ao to.

All other final transcripts must be ordered on the school district website: www.wcpss.net/transcripts. You will be considered a current student until June 30th and transcripts will be free. After the 30th there will be a charge.

Senior Exam Exemption: Any senior earning an "A" average with no more than 3 EXCUSED absences for the semester, a "B" average with no more than 2 EXCUSED absences for the semester and or a "C" average with no more than 1 EXCUSED absence for the semester may be excused from exams excluding courses with EOC's and other state mandated tests, including CTE courses. If you have any UNEXCUSED absences, you will not be exempt.

DRESS CODE FOR GRADUATION

Dress code for graduation will be strictly enforced. We ask for students full cooperation. Questions? Please check with Ms. Newhouse or Ms. Michelle Jones. Any student who cannot acquire an item necessary to meet the dress code requirement, due to extenuating circumstances or extreme hardship should discuss this matter with Ms. Newhouse or Ms. Jones.

BOYS: Wear dress shoes (no topsiders, boots, or tennis shoes), dress socks, dark dress trousers (no jeans), dark tie and a white/light colored dress shirt.

GIRLS: Wear dress shoes or dress sandals (no colorful hose or shoes). Shoes must have a heel strap and a moderate or low heel. Wear either a skirt and blouse or a dress; No clothing should be seen below the hemline of the gown. Reminder: be sure to leave your purse with a parent. There will not be a place to secure such items during graduation and they are not allowed on stage.

COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES— SUNDAY, JUNE 12—4:00 PM

Students should arrive no later than 3:00. Doors will open to the public at 3:15. **BE ON TIME.** All debts must be paid before diplomas will be released. Only students who are eligible for graduation on or before June 12th will be able to participate in graduation exercises. Parking at graduation this year will be \$7.00. Try to arrive early so that finding a parking space will not be a problem.

Please write students name with a dark marker on the inside of your graduation cap on the mortarboard, not the fabric.
