## Teacher Guidance in PowerSchool

There are three levels of courses - Academic, Honors and Advanced Placement. Students may choose courses at any level but should follow the guidance that their teachers provide and the recommendations placed in PowerSchool.

Teachers will give guidance based on previous data and performance in class, prerequisite courses, and other factors that can help to predict student success.

This guidance is offered to suggest the most appropriate level of a course to ensure maximum success for the student. Please review the information placed in PowerSchool before selecting your courses and talk to your teachers/counselor if you have questions about the recommendations.

## Registration Timeline

**February 14-18, 2022:** Teachers will input recommendations for students in PowerSchool.

**February 24, 2022:** Rising 9th Grade Open House & Rising 10th-12th Grade Curriculum Fair

**March 10 - 21, 2022:** Counselors meet with Rising 11th graders individually to discuss registration and input choices in PowerSchool (appointment times will be provided). Students should complete any auditions or applications needed for specific courses. Students that wish to make changes to their choices after their appointment should email their counselor.

**June 10, 2022:** Last day for students to make any changes to course selections for 22-23. Students should email changes to their counselor prior to this date.





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**GPA and Grading Scale**

**Graduation Requirements**

Content Area	Courses/Credits
<b>English</b>	<b>4 Credits</b> English I, II, III, IV (taken in sequence)
<b>Mathematics</b>	<b>4 Credits</b> Math I, Math II, Math III, & a 4th Math aligned with student's post high school plans
<b>Science</b>	<b>3 Credits</b> Earth/AP Environmental Science, Biology, Physical Science/Chemistry/Physics
<b>Social Studies</b>	<b>4 Credits</b> World History, Civic Literacy, American History, Economics and Personal Finance
<b>Healthful Living</b>	<b>1 Credit</b> Healthful Living
<b>Electives</b>	<b>10 Credits</b> Students can choose from courses in Career/Technical Education, Healthful Living, Fine Arts, and World Languages

Note: To meet the minimum admission requirements for the UNC University System, a student must a) complete a specific math sequence and b) have a minimum of **two credits** in the same World Language





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### NC Academic Scholars

Students who complete the requirements for this academically challenging high school program are named NC Academic Scholars and receive special recognition in the graduation program. In order to qualify students must:

- Have a cumulative unweighted GPA of 3.5 at the end of 1st semester Senior year
- Pass Chemistry or Physics
- Pass four elective classes constituting a concentration
- Pass three higher level courses during their Junior or Senior year which carry a 4.5 or 5 quality points

### Latin Honors

WCPSS uses the Latin Academic Honors System. This recognition is based off of the cumulative weighted GPA at the end of the first semester of your senior year. There are three distinct categories for eligibility Cum Laude, Magna Cum Laude, and Summa Cum Laude.

**Cum Laude:** graduating with “honor” by earning a cumulative GPA ranging from 3.75 - 3.99

**Magna Cum Laude:** graduating with “great honor” by earning a cumulative GPA ranging from 4.0 - 4.249

**Summa Cum Laude:** graduating with “highest honor” by earning a cumulative GPA ranging from 4.25 ≤

### Promotion Requirements

### CTE Pathways

Students that take Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses are encouraged to take courses that are in a pathway. When a student takes a level two course in a pathway, they are considered a “concentrator” and are eligible to take the ACT WorkKeys during 12th grade.
