7th Grade curriculum standards and expectations are rigorous. When the PCHS student leaders visited our grade level last year, they shared with 7th graders that this was the grade level where the work seemed to get harder and where they found they had to really learn to study. Our curriculum puts students to the tasks of digging deeper, not just understanding a concept, but applying that concept to a new situation; not just giving an answer, but supporting the answer with evidence from the text. We have helped thousands of 7th graders meet and exceed expected learning outcomes. When your child has a question, please encourage him/her to ask us for help. Our team is happy to help.

Two great tools our 7th graders have at their fingertips this year are PowerSchool, where they can keep up with grades in each class, and our new Google Homework Calendar, customized with all of the homework your child has for each core class. Have your student login and show you the grades in PowerSchool and the assignments noted on the Google Homework Calendar.

Study Tip: Do your homework. Sounds simple enough, but students who don't do the work the day it is assigned not only lose points, but they lose out on important practice intended to help them rehearse and apply what they are learning, leaving them unprepared for the next day's work. So have your student pull up the Google Homework Calendar, take out class notes, and do the homework.
