Musical S.T.E.M. Summer Camp

Complete fun (and sometimes messy) experiments, and build musical instruments. Piano lessons and cool songs that go with the science lesson for Beginners - Level IV. Five camp days, 3 hours per day. Early drop-off available and extended day available. For ages 7-11.

Summer Challenge Camp (Rising 2nd Grade and Up)
