# STUDENT ACCOUNTABILITY PLAN

## SAFETY GUIDELINES

- Complete a Daily Symptom Screening
- All students, employees, and any visitors must complete a daily health screening and temperature check before entering school, per the [Health Screening](#) guidance. Students riding school transportation must have a completed health attestation form before boarding school transportation.

# MASKS!!!



- Students must wear masks at all times, except when actively eating or drinking.
- Students will be given 5 reusable/washable masks, however, they are large and may need some adjusting.
- If a student forgets their mask, a disposable one will be provided.
- Students will be reminded to wear their masks properly over their nose and mouth as necessary throughout the day.
- If students refuse to wear a mask, they will not be allowed to attend school in person and will be enrolled in the Virtual Academy.
- To request an accommodation, parents or guardians must complete this [form](#) and return it, along with supporting documentation, to your school's principal.

# STUDENT HEALTH SCREENING

All students should have their temperature taken every day at home before coming to school. Students **must stay home** if:

- They have tested positive for COVID-19 and have not met the criteria for returning to school (coming in the next slides);
- They have recently had close contact with a person with COVID-19 and have not met the criteria for returning to school;
- They have a temperature of 100.4°F or higher.

In addition, students must be free of any symptoms potentially related to COVID-19 to be on a school campus. At this time, these symptoms include one or more of the following:

- Fever or chills
- New cough (unrelated to allergies)
- New shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- New loss of taste or smell



# Maintain Social Distance

- Students should stay six feet apart from employees, other students or peers.
- Students should not congregate during arrival/dismissal in stationary settings. Schools may alter the typical “traffic flow” inside school buildings to promote and facilitate social distancing in hallways, bathrooms, and during times of transition. Signage will be placed throughout the school building to indicate guidelines.
- Students will be provided opportunities to wash their hands often with soap and water for 20 seconds. Students should avoid touching their eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands. When soap and water is not readily available, students should use hand sanitizer, which will be provided in every classroom and school entrances and exits.



Buildings will be cleaned and disinfected throughout the day and every evening. The CDC defines cleaning as removing germs, dirt and impurities from surfaces or objects.

Disinfecting supplies will be provided to each classroom to support the cleaning of desks and other high touch surfaces between classes, after lunch, and the cleaning of shared program materials/equipment as desired. After school each day, desks and other touch points will be disinfected by custodial staff.



# SCREENING BUS & VENDOR RIDERS



Parents must complete a health Attestation Form before a student may be assigned a seat on a bus. Please click [HERE](#) to complete the form.

All students riding a bus or vendor transportation must wear a face covering unless they have an approved accommodation for medical reasons.

After arriving at school, all bus and vendor riders will be asked the symptom screening checklist questions and have their temperature taken as they exit, before being allowed to enter the building.

If a bus/vendor rider does not pass the health screening, they will enter the building and report to the Care Center.

# STUDENTS EXHIBITING COVID-19 SYMPTOMS



- Students who have experienced at least one COVID-19 symptom should not be in school.
  - Without confirmation of an alternative diagnosis, students should stay home until they (or a family member answering for a younger child) can answer YES to all three of the following questions:
    - Has it been at least 10 days since they first had symptoms?
    - Has it been at least 24 hours since they had a fever without using fever-reducing medicine?
    - Have respiratory symptoms improved, including cough or shortness of breath?

# ASYMPTOMATIC STUDENTS WHO TEST POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

- Students must remain out of school until 10 days have passed since the date of their positive COVID-19 diagnostic test.
  - If a student develops symptoms, they cannot return to school until they meet the criteria for students who have experienced at least one symptom.
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# EXPOSED STUDENTS WITH NO SYMPTOMS



- Exposure is defined as being within 6 feet of someone confirmed to have COVID 19- for more than 15 minutes.
- Students who have been exposed (at school or in the community) to COVID-19 and do not have symptoms must remain out of school for 14 days since their last exposure, even if they test negative for COVID-19. If they develop symptoms, they cannot return to school until they meet the criteria for students who have experienced at least one symptom.

# WHAT IF MY CHILD GETS SICK AT SCHOOL?

- A school employee will escort your child to the Care Center.
- You will be contacted to pick up your child.
- When you arrive at school, you should park in the carpool loop and call 919-431-8010 to receive further directions for student pick up and sign-out.
- If your child is sick, you must report to school to pick them up. They may not ride home on the bus or in vendor transportation.

## REMOTE ASYNCHRONOUS LEARNING DAYS

- Students do not attend school on these days and there is no live instruction. Your child will have assignments to complete and attendance will be based on completed work.

November 18, 23, 24, December 2, 11, January 6, 13, March 10, 11, 12.

## TEACHER WORKDAYS & HOLIDAYS

- **Workdays:** October 23, November 3, December 21, and January 19
- **Holidays:** November 11, November 25 - 27, December 22 - January 1, January 18
- Workdays and Holidays are not instructional days for students. On workdays and holidays, attendance is not taken and there is no work for students to complete.

# WHEN DOES MY CHILD ACTUALLY GO TO SCHOOL?

- \* Plan B students attend school FOUR days each week during the 1st semester.
- \* Virtual Academy students do not attend school during the 1st semester.
- \* These dates are for 1st semester. Stay tuned for 2nd semester dates.

Pre-K, Kindergarten, First, Second and Third Grade students go to school:

- Cohort A - Oct. 26, 27, 28, 29, 30
- **Cohort B - Nov. 2, 4, 5, 6**
- **Cohort C - Nov. 9, 10, 12, 13**
- Beginning November 16th, all PreK-3rd grade students attend school full-time, with the exception of asynchronous remote days, workdays and holidays.


Fourth and Fifth Grades students go to school:

- Cohort A - Nov. 16, 17, 19, 20, Dec. 14, 15, 17, 18
- Cohort B - Nov. 30, Dec. 1, 3, 4, Jan. 4, 5, 7, 8
- Cohort C - Dec. 7, 8, 9, 10, Jan. 11, 12, 14, 15

# Daily Schedule

- 8:45am – 3:45pm
- Instruction Begins at 9:15 a.m.
- Morning Drop Off begins @ 8:45 a.m.
- Check Out cut off time 3:00 p.m.
- Transportation changes cut off 3:00 p.m.
- Buses/Day Care Vans/Carpool @ 3:45 p.m.
- Do not park in emergency lanes or designated spaces.

# ARRIVAL

## CARPOOL

[Carpool](#) entrance is at Perry Creek & Midtown Market only.

Entrance to the campus will be one way with two screening stations. This entrance will merge into one lane with no parking or stopping until you reach the temp. checkpoint. If students pass all screening, they will then be able to be dropped off at carpool loop. If they fail parents will be directed to exit the campus at the back closes to Wake tech area. Parents are prohibited from parking on Perry Creek or Midtown Market and walking their kids onto campus.

If parents desire to park on campus you may do so in carpool loop Parking area, whoever access to the building will be prohibited.

# ARRIVAL

## WALKERS

Students who are walkers and live in .5-mile walking distance of the school must have parents walk them to school to the front entrance. Parents must wait with your child while staff complete student health screenings. Once student passes health screening parent may leave, and student will enter the building .

## BUSES/VANS

Staff will complete student health screenings as students exit buses.

## VENDOR TRANSPORTATION/AFTER SCHOOL CARE

Staff will complete student health screenings before students enter the building. Afterschool care will be offered Nov. 16 by Parks & Rec. With only 24 seats. Cost TBA



# DISMISSAL

- Carpool will be dismissed beginning at 3:45 p.m. Parents must have a carpool tag to match student bag tags. Carpool tags will be provided the first week of school only to car riders.

Depending on the number of carpool students, carpool may take longer than usual to dismiss. Parents are asked not to leave your vehicle and walk to the building to pick up carpool students. You will be asked to return to your vehicle.

- Bus and van riders will be dismissed from TV's socially distanced.

# LATE ARRIVAL & EARLY CHECK OUT



As a reminder, being in school on time is critical to starting the day off right. All students must be in school by 9:10 to avoid being tardy at 9:15. Parents if you arrive late to campus you must remain in your vehicle so your child can be screened, and temp. checked. Any parent who is consistently late may/will be moved to VA.

The early cutoff checkout time will be 3:00 p.m. Transportation changes must also be requested by 3:00 p.m.

For early check outs you must report to the main entrance with your ID and office staff will assist you with checkout. Parents will be prohibited from entering the campus.

If you are picking up a sick student, you must also have ID and wait outside.

# BREAKFAST

- Students will pick up their prepackaged breakfast in the cafeteria.
- Students will eat breakfast in their classrooms.
- Breakfast is free for all students for the 1st semester.

# LUNCH

- Students will eat lunch in their classrooms and will wash their hands before eating.
- Lunch is not self-serve. Lunches will be bagged and brought to the student's classroom.
- Students will not have a choice in what is served.
- Lunch is free for all students for the 1st semester.

# SNACK

- Please pack your child a healthy snack to eat during the day.
- Water fountains will be used to fill water bottles only. Please consider sending your child to school with an easy to fill water bottle labeled with his/her name.

- Students cannot share devices at school.
- If your student has a WCPSS device, he/she will need to bring it back and forth daily. It will need to come charged and with the charger if possible.
- If your child has a personal device, and you are comfortable sending it, you must sign a BYOD Form (Bring Your Own Device) contract and return it to school.



# RECESS



- Playground equipment is closed.
  - Students will participate in organized activities with their class to avoid mixing classes during recess.
  - Students must remain socially distanced at recess and wear masks.
