
9/11 was a traumatic and momentous event for families all over the US. To this day, it is unknown exactly how the hijackers were able to board the planes, but what is known is that the Homeland




Every year, the Norwegian Nobel Committee invites qualified people to submit nominations. These nominations are considered by the Nobel Committee at a meeting where they review a small list of nominated people.

The Committee seeks to achieve a unanimous decision, but sometimes this is not always possible. The committee usually comes to a conclusion in mid-September, but occasionally the final decision will not be made until the last meeting before the official announcement at the beginning of October.



Mad Dash to Jupiter

NASA recently received a signal 540 million miles away. The Juno space craft is now in orbit of Jupiter. The Juno space craft launched on August 5, 2011. The goal for the end of the mission is to find out what is under Jupiter’s fog. This mission is costing NASA millions of dollars, man hours, and stress. The Juno space craft is now the farthest solar powered space craft from Earth, proving the sun’s reach is extensive. Jupiter is a very interesting planet with its solar system like moons.

The probe made harsh maneuvers to slow down. Thirty minutes with full blast, even then it was going well over 1000 miles an hour. Radio Signals in Space?

The star HD 164595 is having a closer look since a Russian telescope detected a strong signal. The star is approximately 94 lightyears away. This signal is now raising questions about extraterrestrials and whether they exist or not. A scientist named Paul Gilster from the Tau Zero foundation says that if the signal was artificial, its strength level could infer that an advanced civilization could exist elsewhere.

According to Sciencealert.com, astronomers over the past several years have detected multiple blasts of radio signals known as fast radio burst (FRB). FRB’s were discovered in 2007. Earlier this year, ten FRB’s were detected and scientists had discovered from old data that they had collected, that there was another FRB in 2012 coming from the same general area.

In November of 2015, six FRB’s were detected in ten minutes and four more later that were spaced out and all coming from the same place. Researchers believe that these bursts are coming from another galaxy, but they cannot pinpoint the exact location of where these bursts are coming from.

The researchers based this theory off of the amount of plasma blasts that was dispersed when the FRB’s were traveling towards Earth. One theory of where the FRB’s came from is that two neutron stars collided and caused an explosive event that created the radio signal bursts.

Even though neither of these parties have enough support to participate in any debates, and potentially be elected this year, who knows, maybe one day voting will be red, blue, or green.


The Great London Fire

Have you ever heard of the great London fire? If not, that is probably because it happened in the 1600s, on September 2, 1666 to be exact. Here are some interesting facts that you might want to know: how the great London fire happened, how long it lasted, and who it affected?

The great London fire happened as a small fire on Pudding Lane, caused by the baker whose name was Thomas Frayne. Frayne was the baker for King Charles II. The fire started at one in the morning and lasted three days. It made a huge impact on thousands of people's lives. The fire burnt down 13, 200 homes and 87 churches, leaving 65,000 people without homes. The fire temperature reached 1250 degrees Celsius taking the lives of six people. 350 years later, a replica was created, which took many months to build, but only a couple of minutes to burn down.

The destruction from the London fire had a huge impact on the city, burning down some of London's most important buildings: the Bride Well Palace, the Steelyard, and Gothic St Paul's.

Air Pollution Can Cause Alzheimer's

Alzheimer's disease also called Dementia is a very progressive disease that destroys people's memories, behaviors, and thinking. Symptoms usually start slowly and get worse over time. Over time the disease gets so bad that it interferes with daily living. Alzheimer's usually affects people around the age of 65, but at least 5% of cases have been in people as young as 40. That is called Early Onset Alzheimer's. Did you know that 60 million people are diagnosed with Alzheimer's every year?

Air pollution is a major cause of Alzheimer's. Most of the air pollution comes from machines such as trucks, cars, buses, etc. Tiny magnetic particles produced by car engines and brakes travel into the human brain leading to the disease. Some factory buildings also give off hazardous chemicals. Carbon dioxide from gasoline fuel, the chemical that cars and trucks give off, also causes Alzheimer's. In some major cities in countries like China, the air pollution is so bad that people have to pack up and leave, others wear masks.



In other parts of the world, the air pollution is so bad that clear skies turn to dark and cloudy ones and you can't see where you're going.

One way to prevent air pollution is to walk, or ride a bike instead of using cars. Conserve energy, remember to turn off lights, and other electrical appliances when you're not using them. Use energy efficient light bulbs and appliances. Use electric or hand-powered lawn care or gas powered equipment, and be careful not to spill gasoline when filling up your car.

Here are tips to help you have a successful and less stressful school year:


- Don't procrastinate! If you do, you may not be able to get all your homework done.

Go for the gold! Before the idea of the Paralympics games, a major international multisport event, people with disabilities were not able to compete in the Olympic Games. Ludwig Guttmann is the man who had the idea in 1960 for wheelchair athletes to compete, which was the first official Paralympics held in Rome.

One of the most common Paralympic sports is track. Competitions in basketball, swimming, and volleyball, among others were later added. There are also winter games similar to the Olympics, played in the snow during the winter time; some competitions include skiing, snowboarding, skating, among other games. The first winter Paralympics was in Ornskoldsvik, Sweden in 1976.



Many Paralympian athletes were in the army or are retired veterans. In fact, the first games were held in Paris in 1924. Paralympics began as a small British group of WWII veterans in 1948, but then grew to be a worldwide sport. Paralympians are awarded medals in the closing ceremonies, just like the Olympics. This year the Paralympics also took place in Rio De Janeiro, Brazil. The 23rd summer Deaflympics, competition for deaf athletes, will be held in 2017 in Samsun, Turkey.

HEISMAN WATCH WEEK 4

The Heisman trophy is a seasonal award given to the best college football player. The ceremony is on December 14, 2016 and presented by the Yale Club of New York City. Last year, the award went to Alabama running back Derrick Henry over Christian McCaffrey and Deshaun Watson. This year analysts are already ranking the top 12 prospects after week 3. Starting at number 12 is a surprise appearance Mitch Trubisky, UNC quarterback. Trubisky, the junior 6-3 220 pound quarterback had an amazing week 3 against James Madison where he threw for 432 yards and 3 touchdowns without an interception. Next, at number 11 is the 2nd out of 5 new additions to the Heisman watch list. Devonta Foreman running back for the Texas Longhorns had an amazing game against California, although they were upset, Foreman ran for 157 yards and 2 touchdowns on 21 carries. Getting in to the top 10 with Patrick Mahomes, Texas Tech quarterback. Mahomes passed for an amazing 470 yards and 5 touchdowns 3 of them being over 20 yards at 36, 42, and 64 yards each. Jabrill Peppers out of Michigan coming in at number 9. Although Michigan was nearly upset by Colorado, Peppers is the only defensive player on the list and has totaled up 25 tackles and 2 sacks in 3 games! Washington football does that seem like a big deal? No, well it is and only recently because of Jake Browning, the number 8 prospect. By statistics, Browning is the most effective QB so far. Browning has totaled up 744 yards and 12 touchdowns with a 71.6 completion rate. The number

7 prospect previously in 13th, has risen the most compared to any other prospect. Donnell Pumphrey, San Diego State running back, is small at only 5'9 and 170 pounds, but he runs a 4.33 40 yard dash. So far this season, he has 599 yards and 7 touchdowns; an amazing reality because most backs' season goal is 1,000 yards. Next up, Georgia running back Nick Chubb, a Georgia native, Chubb overcame a knee injury in 2015. Already this season Chubb has 365 yards and 3 touchdowns on only 71 attempts, which puts him at number 6. Now in the top 5, starting with Leonard Fournette, LSU running back. Fournette has shattered records as a rookie two years ago and now a junior, Fournette is averaging almost 100 yards and 1 touchdown a game. At number 4 is Deshaun Watson, Clemson quarterback. Watson almost won it all last year, but is looking to do it this year. He has 692 yards and 7 touchdowns. The top 3 starts with J.T Barrett, Ohio State quarterback. Ohio State looked like the scariest team in college football ever seen against Oklahoma. It takes a lot to roll by a number 14 like OSU did, but J.T. Barrett made it look easy with 152 yards and 4 touchdowns. The second best player in college football is Christian McCaffrey, Stanford running back and son of Ed McCaffrey. He ran for 165 yards and a touchdown in the 27-10 victory over USC. Finally, Lamar Jackson is at number 1, without a doubt, the best player football has ever seen. Jackson had 913 yards and 8 touchdowns, but that was just passing; he has 464 yards and 10 touchdowns rushing. Louisville blew out number 2 Florida State 63-20 and rose from 10 to 3 in the rankings.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL BACK IN SEASON




