SCHOLARSHIPS THAT ARE COLLEGE / UNIVERSITY RELATED

UNC CHAPEL HILL AND OR DUKE UNIVERSITY: ROBERTSON SCHOLARS: Students must apply to Duke or Chapel Hill by the respective Early or regular deadlines. Duke's early decision deadline is November 15, 2016 and regular deadline is January 1, 2017. UNC-Chapel Hill's early action deadline is October 15, 2016 and regular decision deadline is January. Students may self nominate by completing the Robertson online application. Robert-sonscholars.org/apply/

<u>UNC CHARLOTTE:</u> The University Scholarship Office serves as the champion for scholarship administration at UNC Charlotte by making it easier for students to find, apply for, and receive merit or need-based scholarships. Working closely with the academic colleges to support a central application process, the University Scholarship Office connects current and potential students in all majors with scholarship opportunities. Students are encouraged to visit the University Scholarship Office and explore the types of scholarships and the online scholarship database for resources that can help reduce college-related costs. NC State: The Office of Scholarships and Financial Aid offers a limited number of competitive scholarships for entering freshmen in an effort to recognize and encourage exceptional academic ability and talent. To be considered, students must apply for admission by October 15. Some academic scholarships also require that students demonstrate financial need. All students who apply for admission by October 15 and apply for financial aid by submitting the *Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)* <u>http://fafsa.ed.gov/</u> by March 1 will automatically be considered for need-based academic scholarships. <u>General Hugh Shelton Leadership Initiative Scholarship http://sheltonleadership.ncsu.edu/leadership-scholarships/about-shelton-national-leadership-scholarship/</u> – Competitive academic scholarship program to promote the mission of the Shelton initiative, "to inspire, educate and develop value-based leaders committed to personal integrity, professional ethics, and selfless service."

<u>Chancellor's Leadership Scholarship</u> - Program for students with demonstrated leadership potential, academic achievement, personal talents, unique work or service experience, financial need, and a demonstration for overcoming personal adversity. A preference will be given to those individuals who will enhance and contribute to NC State's diversity. Students who apply for admission by October 15 and submit a FAFSA by March 1 are automatically considered.

Goodnight Scholarship: To be eligible you must complete a general NC State application using the **wolfPAW** system. Select a STEM major or STEM Education major. Students who are invited to apply typically rank in the top 2% of their class, Score above 1400 on the SAT and/or scores above a 32 on ACT and have at least a 3.9 (unweighted) GPA and or 4.8 (weighted). If you do not receive an invitation to apply from NC State and want to self nominate submit your nomination form by December 10th. Forms are available at emas.ncsu.edu/goodnight/how-to-apply/.

Each of the Colleges at NC State offers scholarship opportunities to students enrolled in their academic programs. Consult the college website for specific criteria, application materials, and important deadlines.

<u>Howard University</u>: Freshman Scholarship (HUFS) Program is designed to assist accepted First-Time-in-College students who have demonstrated outstanding academic achievement throughout their secondary school career and have chosen to attend Howard University. Scholarships are automatically awarded on a first-come, first-served, basis to eligible candidates. A separate application is not required. <u>Scholarships are awarded un-</u> til all funds have been exhausted and not all eligible applications will receive an award.

Shaw University: Basic Requirements:

- Must be registered full-time, taking 12 credit hours for undergraduate students and 9 credit hours or more for graduate students
- Must be a currently enrolled freshman, sophomore, junior, senior or graduate student
- Must have a minimum grade point average of 2.50 (based on a 4.0 scale) **NOTE:** GPA requirements may vary based on donor's criteria. Some scholarships may require students to be a U.S. Citizen or eligible non-citizen. Must complete a short essay
