
Students will be assessed throughout the year in class.

•The purpose of homework is to encourage responsibility and to practice kindergarten skills.


•Students should be read to every night. Students will also need to complete ELA activities as assigned.

•Students will have some math homework to practice the day's skills.

•When there is no homework, or when you have extra time, please complete the activities in the Daily Folder or have students complete a Dreambox lesson or practice in Letterland.

Snacks and Drinks

- •Please send in a snack and water bottle each day.
- Please make sure any containers can be opened independently by your child.
 Please send in a spoon if needed for snack or lunch.



Reading

•We will be learning about letters and sounds using **Letterland**. We will then use this knowledge to blend sounds to read words.

Reading

• We will also be working on phonemic awareness using **Heggerty**. During this time students will practice identifying rhyming words, isolating beginning and ending sounds, blending and segmenting words, adding, deleting and substituting words, alphabet knowledge and language awareness. Hand motions are used during instruction as a kinesthetic way to support learning.

Reading

•We also have a Language Comprehension block of instruction. During this time we will use the same book for several days to work on comprehension skills and expand our vocabulary. This is also when we will build our foundational reading skills, such as our understanding of authors and illustrators, that we read from left to right and that stories have a beginning, middle and end.

Writing

- •Will not start out looking like actual writing!
- •Spelling is not a focus.
- •Students stretch out sounds they hear to make words.

Letter formation is very important.
It takes all of us working together to help your child with handwriting.
Correct pencil grip is also very important.
