School Community

East Wake High School is located in rural Eastern Wake County, approximately 12 miles east of Raleigh, NC. The diverse school population consists of students who reside in Wendell, Zebulon, Knightdale, and Raleigh. EWHS serves 1389 students in grades 9-12. The academic program is organized on a 4 x 4 block schedule. EWHS is operating for the fifth year as one comprehensive high school. Prior to the 2015-16 school year, EWHS campus consisted of four small schools: Arts Education and Global Studies; Engineering Systems; Integrated Technology, and Health Science. EWHS is accredited by the North Carolina State Board of Education and AdvancEd. EWHS is a part of the Wake County Public School System which consists of 191 schools and approximately 160,000 students.
