ALTSON BOWMAN SCHOOL COUNSELOR


- This is my 17th year as an elementary school counselor and my 2nd year at AES. I love getting to serve the community I've called home my entire life.






Meeting Each Child's Needs

Staggered Entry



On your child's staggered entry day, we will be completing the Wake County Kindergarten Entry Assessments.

What are we assessing?

 Social interaction/development, letter/sound identification, phonological awareness skills, number sense, math readiness, early print awareness/reading readiness, fine and gross motor skills, name recognition

•We use these assessments to begin planning your child's instruction. We will share the results with you at your first quarter conference.

We are excited to meet your child in a small group setting!

Staggered Entry

- 9:30-10:00 am: Check-In at the cafeteria
 - Students will be dropped off by parent/guardian
 - Check in with staff
 - Take picture with your Cougar cub
 - Drop off school supplies if you have them
- During the day:
 - Students will eat lunch (pack a lunch or send money)
 - Students will visit specials
 - Students will eat snack (pack a healthy snack)
 - Students will play at recess
- o 3:45pm: Dismissal
 - Students will be picked up in carpool.
 - Each student will be have a tag attached to their backpack that shows how they will go home (bus, carpool, daycare van, walk, YMCA) at the end of each day starting September 5, 2023..



Staggered Entry

- · Attend ONLY one day during this first week
- Full school day including lunch and snack
- Your child's designated staggered entry date will be emailed to you & posted, by last name alphabet, on our website early to mid August
- Teacher Assignments shared via email the evening of August 31, 2023 your child's teacher might not be the same teacher they had at staggered entry teacher
- Meet the Teacher: September 1, 2023
- ALL kindergarten students will return to school September 5, 2023

Ways to Help Your Child



Ways to Help Your Child



Practice self-help skills:

- Flushing the toilet (Boys need to be familiar with the urinal) and personal hygiene (wiping themselves)
- Washing hands with soap
- Buttoning, zipping, and snapping pants
- If you choose to put your child in a belt, he/she should be able to unbuckle and buckle the belt independently.
- Tying shoes (We love velcro)
- Put on and zip/button coat
- $\circ\,$ Opening and closing lunch bags/containers

Ways to Help Your Child



- Read to your child EVERY day! ☺
- Encourage your child to use conventional speech patterns. ("May I go to the bathroom?" rather than "I go potty.")
- Model and encourage correct production of letter sounds and words ("horse" instead of "horsey" and "like" instead of "wike")
- Practice putting things in and out of his/her backpack. As a grade level, we do not check backpacks after the first full week of school. We expect your child to take his/her daily materials out independently each day with reminders.
- Talk with your child about his/her lunch (do you have a lunch bag?, are you buying?) and snack (where is it?, etc)
- Help your child look forward to school and talk about it in a friendly way to help your child be excited.

Transportation

- If you would like your child to ride the bus, please go onto the <u>transportation website</u> to complete the <u>bus rider registration</u>. This registration must be filled out and processed before your child will be eligible for bus service.
- What do you do if there is a change in transportation?

 If you know about the change in advance, please send a written note or email to your child's teacher.

- For same day changes, call the school (919-387-2150) and let the office know your child's name, teacher's name, and the change in transportation. These requests must be made by 2:45 P.M.
- Contact the office if you have a permanent transportation change.

You can prepare at home by allowing your child to open containers, encouraging independence while cleaning up, and establishing regular meal times for your family.

Health

- All <u>required Immunizations</u> and the Kindergarten <u>Health Assessment</u> form (English, Spanish) are due by the first day of school.
- If your child has <u>regular or emergency medication</u> that needs to be administered at school, the medication must be brought to the school by the parent with the 1702 form (<u>English</u>, <u>Spanish</u>) filled out by the doctor.
- Wake County policy indicates that students should be fever free without the aid of medication for 24 hours before returning to school. Please help us keep all of our Cougars safe and healthy!


