Istation

Your child's teacher will be using istation to assess your child's progress toward becoming an independent reader. This assessment will take place remotely in September for all students in grades K-5. It usually takes 30-40 minutes. This is one way for your child's teacher to decide on the best literacy instruction for his/her needs.

The classroom teacher will let your child know when to take the assessment and which assessment to take.

To take the assessment your child will need an environment free of distractions. A headset is a good idea to help with this. It will also help our younger students to hear the

sounds asked for more clearly. Please encourage your child to pay close attention to the screen to do their best work.

As the year goes on your child will interact with this platform several times, both as an assessment and as a learning tool.
