# **SEEKING VOLUNTEERS to HELP IN THE CAFÉ and More**

If you are interested in supporting students and staff by helping to supervise students in the cafeteria during lunch, please see the information below about registering/reregistering as a volunteer. Volunteers require background checks and registration must be completed at a WCPSS work site (school). Once a prospective volunteer has passed the required background check, he/she will be eligible to help supervise students during lunch, work in our Media Center, and in a few cases, work with teachers. Some teachers have identified that they might benefit from another trustworthy adult supporting learning. These teachers will reach out to you if they have need of a volunteer. Please note that not all of our staff will have opportunities available for volunteers in the classrooms at this time.

# View <u>wcpss.net/WhenToReturn</u> for requirements to return after a COVID-19 diagnosis, exposure, or symptoms.

- Students may remain in school without any exclusion period following a non-household exposure to COVID-19 (e.g., during an afterschool activity, while eating lunch, at a community activity) as long as your child does not have symptoms. This exemption applies to both masked and unmasked non-household exposures.
- If a student has a household exposure, they must stay home for 5 days following the last exposure to the household member who has been diagnosed with COVID-19 unless they were diagnosed with COVID-19 in the past 90 days or are up to date on vaccinations.
- If your child is not able to separate from the household member, their 'last exposure' would be the day your household member's isolation period ends their five-day quarantine period begins after that.

# **VOLUNTARY COVID-19 TESTING**

COVID-19 testing is an effective way to reduce transmission, especially when layered with other measures.
