## **Helpful Tips for Setting up an At-Home Learning Space:**

- 1. **Designate a space just for learning** so your child's mind and body see the space as a place for work, not play. Try to be as far away as possible from distractions like siblings, toys, and TV. Plan to eat meals in another space.
- 2. **Use what you already have**. A cup from the kitchen can hold writing utensils. An old box decorated by your child can hold books and papers. Your child's bookbag is another great place to store their supplies. The coffee table or folding table can become a desk.
- 3. **Declutter the space**. Include only what is needed for learning. Writing utensils, supplies, technology, and an electrical outlet for device charging should be nearby.
- 4. **Shhh Keep it Quiet!** Keep TVs and other devices off.
- 5. **Create a comfortable space and size accordingly**. Add a pillow to a kitchen chair so your child has a comfy seat at the right height. Use a swivel office chair so your child can wiggle while they learn.
- 6. **Create a well-lit area** to decrease eye strain and promote focus.
- 7. Plan the space with your child so they feel ownership and are excited about learning in it.

## Special Note:

When your SCE Bluejay is interacting with their teacher and/or class, **your home is in view and within earshot**. Please work with us to monitor and limit things that can be seen and/or heard but are not appropriate for school. You may want to create a learning space that has your child's back (and the camera on their device) facing a wall or corner. This way, the camera only sees your child.

**Back to School Student Materials Pick-Up**: If you were unable to collect your child's materials - don't worry! You can stop by anytime this week at a time that works for you. Contact your child's teacher or our front office staff (919-570-2100), and someone will meet you in the carpool loop when you arrive. We want to make sure your child has these materials to use during lessons in the coming weeks.

## Meals for Students:

Effective September 1, families are required to provide a student ID number and pay for their meals based on their meal benefits status. Families are encouraged to use <a href="MySchoolBucks">MySchoolBucks</a> to prepay for meals to reduce any payment collection at the curb.

Eligibility and application information is posted on <u>wcpss.net/meals</u>. For the 2020-2021 school year, students who qualify for reduced-price meals will be receive breakfast and lunch at no cost.
