\*Rates are based on the 2019-2020 school year and may change for '21-22. The amount is for Monday through Friday (we do not offer daily or drop-in care). You pay the full fee regardless of number of days your child attends.

#### <u>Hotspots</u>

Any student who has a WCPSS-issued **hotspot must return** it. For in-person students, make plans to drop off/return your hotspot anytime between now and June 18. *Students are not required to return their Chromebooks to their school unless they are leaving WCPSS.*
